

Base Office Number 180, having been duly sworn and advised of his rights,
under the 21st Article of War, deposes and says:

"1. The object observed appeared to be a small explosion without
streams.

"2. The location of this observation was $19^{\circ}05'N$ - $164^{\circ}05'E$, date
and time 06 May 1948, time 0905Z.

"3. The weather at the time of the observation was 4/10 to 5/10
cloudiness, overcast approximately six (6) thousand feet.

"4. There were no other witnesses to this observation.

"5. There were no photos taken of this incident.

"6. Only one explosion was observed - it was white in color.
Relative to the intensity, it was directly on course of the observer and
approximately 10,000 feet. No sound could be heard. No smoke or
other phenomena had no effect on clouds that could be observed.
