"Reference letter AKADB 452.1, subj, "Unconventional Aircraft," dated 1 February 1949.

"VLEITOOR, GE, Commander, this headquarters reported presence of two unidentified flares near Killeen Base. First flare occurred between 1930 and 000, 6 March 1949, approximately half mile north of Killeen Base. Second flare noticed 0145, 7 March 1949, approximately three miles from Killeen Base. No other information available at this time. Investigation being conducted by representatives of Killeen Base and G-2, this headquarters. You will be advised of developments. Complete report will follow."
