1. Date of Observation: 16 April 1949 Date of Interview: 21 April 1949
2. Exact time of Observation (CST): 1725 hours
3. Place of Observation:
Intersection of 11th Street and Grand Avenue, Fort Smith, Arkansas,
(approximately four blocks from center of business district)
4. Position of observer:
Observer was travelling east along Grand Avenue (see attached sketch).
Object was first sighted from automobile while observer was waiting
for traffic light to change. Upon sighting, observer stepped
out of car and watched object until it disappeared.
5. What attracted attention to object:
Immediately after traffic light changed to red, observer stopped his
car and glanced up at light. He noticed object in the sky at an
elevation of approximately 15° directly above the light.
6. Number of objects:
Only one object was seen.
7. Apparent size:
Object appeared to be the size of a five-cent coin held at arms length.
8. Color of object:
Object appeared to be colorless and bright.
9. Shape:
Outline of object was perfectly round. Observer stated that no details
of object could be seen and he did not know whether object resembled
a disc or a ball.
10. Altitude:
Observer believed elevation of object to be between 10,000 and 12,000
feet. Angle of elevation above horizon was approximately 30° .
11. Direction from observer:
Object was first observed at a magnetic bearing of approximately 85°
from observer.
12. Distance from observer:
Observer estimated distance from object as being between ~~four~~
^{0.2} and four miles.
13. Direction of flight:
Object was flying in a southeasterly direction while observed.

completed two and one-half years of college and two years in a theological seminary. He resigned his position in the Methodist ministry several years ago and has been employed by the Post Office Department since that time.

[REDACTED] does not wear glasses for distant vision and his eyesight is believed to be very good. Upon being asked regarding the possibility of his mistaking a conventional aircraft for the object, he stated, "I am certain it was not an airplane. I observed it closely to see if I could be mistaken and it was just and I have described it to you."

GENERAL

1. Teletype sequences of Fort Smith, Arkansas, surface weather conditions from 1230 to 2030 hours, 16 April 1949 were as follows:

2. No winds aloft graphs or adiabatic charts are prepared by the Fort Smith office of the US Weather Bureau.
3. No commercial airline flights were in the vicinity at the time of sighting. Braniff Air Lines flight from Little Rock, Arkansas, arrived at the Fort Smith airport at 1550 hrs on 16 April. It departed for Tulsa, Oklahoma, at 1600 hrs. The next scheduled flight arrived at Fort Smith at 2305 hrs. At least two privately owned aircraft were believed to be flying in the vicinity at the time but no record is kept of these flights. No military aircraft were believed to be in the vicinity at the time.
4. No weather balloons or other testing devices are released by the Fort Smith office of the US Weather Bureau. Nearest point of release for such devices is believed to be at the Municipal Airport, Tulsa, Oklahoma. Tulsa is located approximately 100 air miles northwest of Fort Smith.
5. No soil samples were obtained as object is not believed to have contacted earth.
6. Sketch of terrain surrounding point of observation is attached as enclosure No 1.

14. Time in sight:
Approximately one minute

15. Speed: **UNCLASSIFIED**
Observer estimated speed of object at 200 miles per hour. Approximately one minute was required for object to cover an angular distance of 15°. Line of flight was away from observer at an approximate angle of 45°.

16. Sound and Odor:
No sound or odor were noticed.

17. Trail:
No trail was seen.

18. Luminosity:
Object appeared to be visible by reflection. Observer stated that object looked like a "huge round mirror." No reflected rays of sunlight were noticed.

19. Projections:
No projections were noticed.

20. Maneuvers:
Object maintained a straight and level line of flight during observation.

21. Manner of disappearance:
Object disappeared behind a row of trees located at a magnetic bearing of approximately 100° from observer.

22. Effect on clouds:
No clouds were observed in the vicinity of object.

23. Weather conditions and light at time of sighting:
Weather was clear and visibility good at time of sighting. The sun was shining and light was excellent.

24. Additional information:
During observation, witness said he pointed out object to several other persons who had gotten out of cars in the line of traffic behind his vehicle. Identity of these persons was unknown to observer. No other reports of the sighting have been received.

Observers name is ██████████. His address is ██████████, Fort Smith, Arkansas. He is 52 years of age and is employed as a special delivery messenger by the US Post Office at Fort Smith. He lives on an acreage on the outskirts of Fort Smith and devotes his spare time to farming and gardening.

██████████ has an excellent reputation in the community. His immediate superior at the local Post Office as well as other acquaintances regard him highly. One neighbor, in commenting on his integrity, stated "If ██████████ says anything's so, it's so." ██████████


