Appeared of high integrity and average intelligence but her estimates of speed and size is perhaps below normal.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY:

At 0500Z, 4 May 1949 [REDACTED] age 60, witnessed from the front porch of her home in Limona, Florida, a bright, shining and flaming object in the sky. This object was estimated to be anywhere from one-half mile to five miles away when first sighted. (Not knowing the size of the object she was unable to make a good estimate of the distance). When first sighted the object was shining through the tree tops but later rose to an angle of about twenty degrees above the horizon before dropping again to disappear behind the horizon.

It was in sight for approximately fifteen minutes and had the appearance of an extremely bright moon with a ragged flaming border but was not so bright as to blind the observer. The flaming border seemed to droop at the bottom, forming a short ragged tail-like effect. When first seen it appeared to be about the size of a dinner plate. When last seen, after it had moved some distance away, it appeared to be about the size of a tea saucer.

The object was first sighted to the west of the observer behind tree tops, it then rose with a quivering motion to about the height of a fourteen-story building. Then it moved slowly back and forth, up and down, and from side to side with an irregular quivering motion, working its way toward the west to eventually disappear below the horizon. The movements were not rapid.

There was no evidence of a trail or exhaust. No smoke and no odor. There were no clouds, haze, or smoke reportedly by the observer.

The object shone with a steady light for the entire period of observation.

There were no apparent means of support, propulsion, or control. There were no air ducts, slots, or openings.

The estimated speed was similar to that of an airship, perhaps from twenty to forty miles per hour. It made no sound.

It disappeared from sight by dropping below the horizon.

The following information is relative to the observer.

Miss [redacted], age 60, Post Office Box Number [redacted] Limona, Florida (near Tampa). Occupation: Graduate Public Health Nurse, employed by the City of Tampa Public Health Department, Tampa, Florida. Miss [redacted] has no pertinent hobbies. Her color perception is good, her ability to estimate speed and size is only fair and perhaps below average. Her reliability as an observer should be excellent. No other observations of a similar nature have been made by her. Her attention was drawn to this sighting by her two dogs barking loudly in the yard and when she got out of bed to investigate the disturbance the light of the object attracted her attention. The dogs stopped barking soon after Miss Sherman came out into the yard. She was not able to establish what had aroused the dogs as everything outside in the yard seemed in order.

There were no other reported witnesses of this event, however an unconfirmed report reveals that several school children and one adult witnessed a similar object a few days previously.

Miss Sherman's report seemed completely reliable and she seemed a person of high integrity, average intelligence, and good character.
