




When making this turn it appeared to be more of a square turn and not like

Comments of Interrogator relative to intelligence and character of observer(s):

Note: This officer while interviewing this subject was much impressed by his attitude. While it appeared to embarrass the subject considerable by telling such a story with the thought that people would think he was crazy, never the less he felt it was his duty to report it to proper authorities. This subject appeared to be of average or above average intelligence, spoke with good vocabulary and seemed to be of sound character.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY:

I was enroute from Bellefontaine to Lima, O. Saturday June 11, 1949 about 5:20PM over route 33 and 117. When about 1 mile South of Huntsville, Ohio I noticed an object in the air and it seemed to be ~~xxx~~ diving directly at the highway in front of me and it looked like it might strike me. I pulled the car to the side of the highway quickly and got out, shading my polaroid glasses with my hands to obtain a better look. I observed an object approaching from high in front of me and a little to my right at what appeared to be a terrific speed. The object dove directly toward the highway and when about 1000 feet above the ground it turned to its right and ~~xxx~~ headed north and west. When approaching head on it appeared to be oval in shape with small short objects protruding from the lower half, much like the appearance of a Seals (See Diagram No. 1) Flippers. When making its turn it appeared to be more of a square turn and not like an airplane. It's actions could best be described that it looked like a puppet on a string with someone guiding same. As this object made its bank or turn to the right it's form took on the shape of being perfectly round or oval with a terrific, blinding light shining from it. It possibly was the sun's reflection. I was wearing polaroid glasses at the time. It then headed straight away from me to the North west at a very high rate of speed and took the shape of a perpendicular line. (See Diagram) As the craft was approaching me I looked about me to see if ~~ka~~ there was anyone else about to see it. There was no one working in the fields nor anyone that I could stop on the highway. I looked for any smoke, flames or sound but there was none. I checked the area after the craft had left for any sound from nearby tractors, trains etc. which might have covered any sound it may have made but there was none. I proceeded into Huntsville and stopped at the filling station and asked ~~ki~~ two men there if they had heard an airplane go over head and they answered negative. I then went on home and told my wife and no one else until this officer appeared today.

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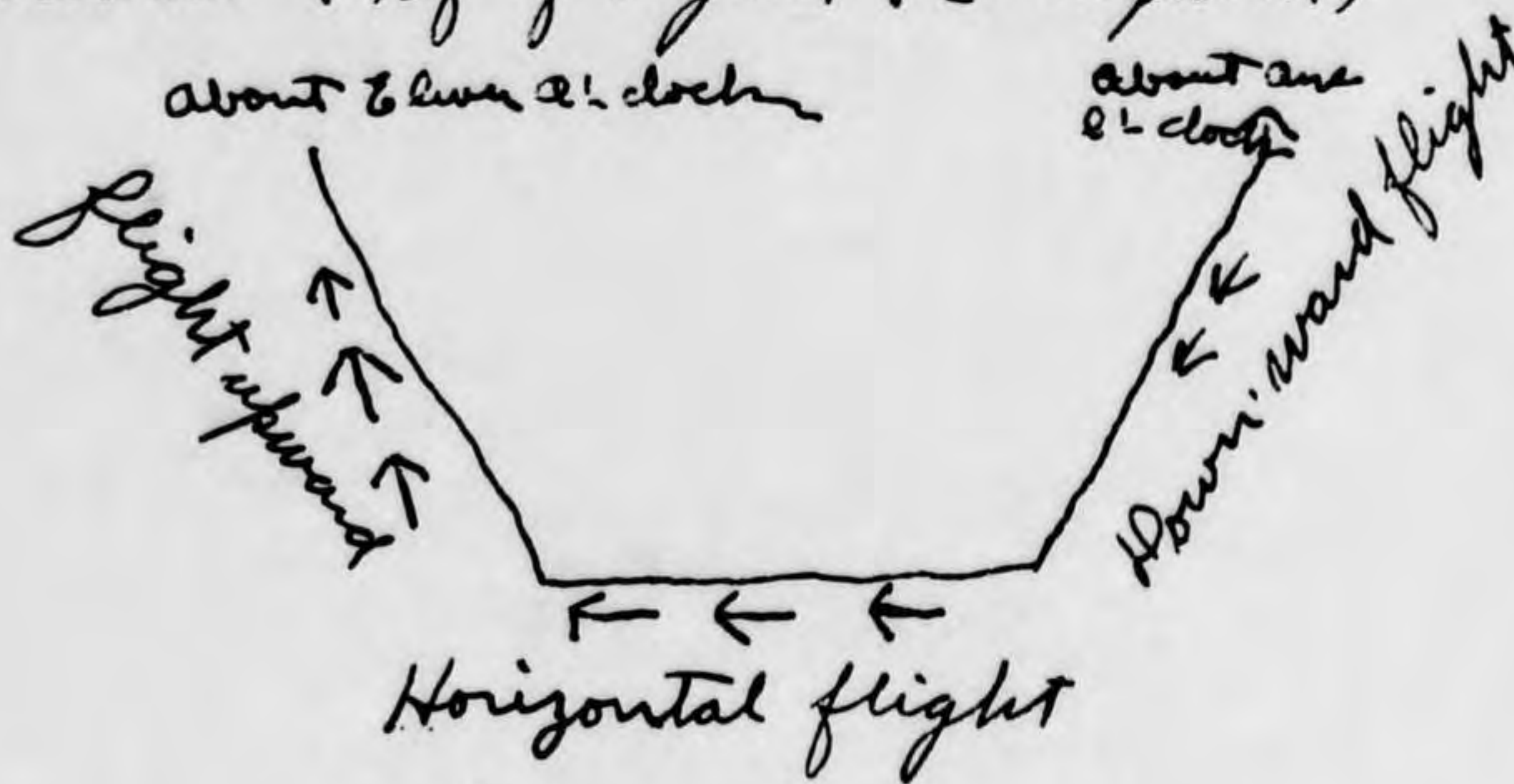

(12) I was about a mile south of Huntville Ohio. This object was the distance of two city blocks ahead of me, About two hundred feet from the earth.

(15) Object traveled so fast I had no way of checking time. not over two minutes for the whole flight as diagrammed. I thought at first it would hit my car. I stopped very quick and jumped out just as object started it Horizontal flight. It was only a few seconds in Horizontal and upward flight out of my sight.

- (16) There was no sound or odor. After object traveled out of sight I drove to Huntsville and ask some men who were setting out in yard if they had heard a aeroplane or similar sound just before I drove up. They had not heard any sound of any kind. (I didn't tell them what I saw.
- (17) There was ^{nothing} to indicate exhaust or vapor coming from this object.
- (18) Its color was of a very high degree of brilliance. Like a very high polished mirror
- (19) There was projections on each side, as object was on ^{its} downward flight. They are hard to describe. looked like very short fins. such a a seal has on front of its body.
- (20) object seemed to be under perfect control and flew just as diagram indicates. (Diagram (13)) direction of flight.
- (21) as object started its upward flight it seemed to become a thin line about the width of your hand and disappeared very quickly and completely.

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
