



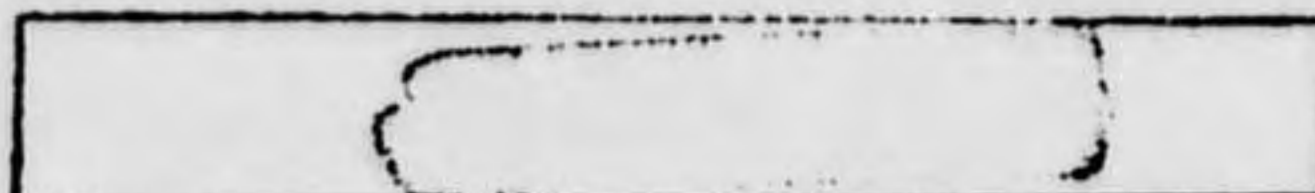

SYNOPSIS <p>Investigation predicated upon receipt of verbal instructions from Lt Col MATTHEW THOMPSON, AO-902812, District Commander, 13th OSI District, Offutt Air Force Base, Omaha, Nebraska. Balloon sighted over Black Hills area approximately 24 June 1949, described as approximately one hundred (100) feet in diameter, either white or silver in color, with some object suspended from the under side and a tail of approximately ten (10) feet in length. Subject balloon identified by Mr. [REDACTED], Engineer for General Mills, Incorporated, of Minneapolis, Minnesota, as one being used for cosmic ray research for the Navy Department. Balloon remained in this area for approximately three (3) or four (4) days. Present location unknown.</p>

DETAILS:

1. Investigation predicated upon receipt of verbal instructions from Lt Col MATTHEW THOMPSON, AO-902812, District Commander, 13th OSI District, Offutt Air Force Base, Omaha, Nebraska, after having been informed of the incident verbally by the writer.

AT RAPID CITY, SOUTH DAKOTA

2. On 29 July 1949, Mr. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~, City Editor for the Rapid City Journal, Rapid City, South Dakota, was interviewed and advised the writer that Subject balloon was first sighted near Deadwood, South Dakota, on approximately 24 June 1949, and at that time was approximately 5,000 feet high and appeared to be standing practically still. The person who gave the first report (name not known) described the balloon as approximately one hundred (100) feet in diameter, either white or silver in color, with what appeared to be a tail of approximately ten (10) feet in length, and had some object suspended from the under side of the balloon. Mr. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ further advised that on 28 June 1949 Mr. J. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~, Engineer for General Mills, Incorporated, of Minneapolis, Minnesota, arrived in Rapid City and stated that the balloon was one manufactured by his firm which was being used by the Navy Department for cosmic ray research, and had been released from Camp Ripley, Minnesota, the preceding week. According to Mr. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ Mr. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ stated that Subject balloon was carrying harmless cosmic ray research instruments and that he would pay a five dollar (\$5.00) reward for the plastic balloon and a twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) reward for the instruments. Mr. KALISZEWSKI described the balloon as being made from plastic, 105 feet in diameter, white in color, and what was reported as being a tail was probably part of the mooring rope.

AT RAPID CITY AIR FORCE BASE, WEAVER, SOUTH DAKOTA

3. On 28 June 1949 an aircraft piloted by Lt. Col. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ R. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~, AO-45599, and Major ELMER H. HAMMER, AO-46014, was dispatched at the request of the writer to search the entire Black Hills area for the balloon. However, no trace of the balloon could be found.

4. The last report on Subject balloon was received on 1 July 1949 from a Mr. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~, Rapid City, South Dakota, who stated that he saw the balloon very high over Rapid City at approximately 2000 hours on 30 June 1949.

5. Since 1 July 1949 an informal and unofficial report was received that the balloon had returned to the vicinity of Minnesota and had gone down and was in the hands of General Mills, Incorporated, Minneapolis, Minnesota.

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Mrs. Eleanor Scaife [redacted] Astoria, Long Island, was interviewed at 0930 hours, 23 July 1949.

People present: Mr. [redacted], Mrs. Scaife and the writer.

A previous check with Mrs. [redacted] employers indicate that she has held her present position with Corn Products Refining Company for 30 years and is considered a stable type of person, not prone to exaggeration or verbosity. No further check of her character or background was performed.

Report of Interview: Mrs. [redacted] reports that on the evening of 24 June 1949 she returned from work at 1830 hours and immediately started to prepare supper. She turned on the radio at the same time so as to "hear Lowell Thomas". The reported objects appeared, according to Mrs. [redacted] prior to the advent of the Lowell Thomas program, which would place her time of observation between 1830 and 1845 hours D.S.T.

The objects were described by Mrs. [redacted] as being round and between 1 1/2 and 2 feet in diameter, gray in color, surrounded by a halo of light and travelling in the direction of west to east, disappearing into a "cloud bank".

The objects appeared to be travelling in a horizontal direction for the first two seconds and then appeared to describe an upward arc just prior to disappearance. An interpretation of Mrs. Scaife's description of the position of the objects would place them approximately 100 to 150 feet in the air. It must be borne in mind, however, that determination of altitude without adequate reference marks is practically impossible for the average lay person.

Within a minute (estimated) of the time that the objects were sighted, a single engine "fighter type" airplane appeared from the south and was observed by Mrs. Scaife to circle the area and then disappear in a southerly direction at an estimated altitude of 1,000 feet.

Attached herewith is a slip of paper, signed by Mrs. [redacted] which was written by her within two hours following the time of her observation of the phenomenon reported.

Comments of preparing officer: The observation was made through an open window, and it is my belief that Mrs. [redacted] had a clear unobstructed view of the area. There are definite points of landscape which afford an easy method of orientation. The house is so situated that there is a clear unobstructed view to a clump of trees approximately 150 years distant followed by another grove of trees which are approximately an additional 150 feet away.

A visit was made to the weather station at La Guardia Field, Station WBAS. The following official observations were noted by Mr. E. Morin, observer on duty at 1100 hours, for the time of 1723 to 1800 E.S.T. on the date of 24 June:

1723 E.S.T.: Clear, 10 mile visibility, temperature 84, dew point 61, wind SSE 18 miles an hour light gusts, humidity 46%.

1745 E.S.T.: Clear, 10 mile visibility, wind SSE 18, few cirrus.


1800 E.S.T.: 35,000 feet thin scattered, 10 mile visibility, wind SSE 17.

There were no unusual weather conditions reported. Sunset was 1931 hours E.S.T. revealing a complete disc of sun.

Certain balloons had been released at 1550 hours E.S.T., said observer on duty at the time of the visible observations, Mr. ~~Joseph [redacted]~~. The field is three miles NNE from the reporting position, and the wind would carry a balloon or another airdrome-released object in a direction away from the field.

Personal investigation revealed no reports of any unusual circumstances in the vicinity of either La Guardia Airport or Flushing Airport on the date of the 24th.

Attention is invited to the fact that objects, as reported, were travelling into the prevailing wind.
