NARRATIVE SUMMARY:

On the evening of July 3, 1949 at about 10:20 - 10:30 P.M. I saw a strange aircraft at about 5 miles distant at about 40-45 degrees angle, would not guess as to height possibly 2 miles.

Outline appeared very faint, do not know length but would ~~guess~~ guess as about 500 ft long and about 50 ft high, had 3 or 4 large round windows which emitted a very bright light and trailed a tail of ship was going from South to North at a great rate of speed was seen from the top of the haze on the horizon in the south to the haze in the horizon there disappeared, about 10-15 seconds. This craft was not a flying saucer, but from its speed and shape it is not based on this clay marble which we call earth.

I have reported this craft to Dr. Draper of the Buhl Planetarium N S Pgh, Pa., and he did not have any reports of this ship.
