1. On 9 July 1949 at Tivariak Island, Arctic, Mr. [REDACTED] of the Arctic Institute to Alaska Air Command was, in his capacity as a weather observer, a member of the Arctic Survey, Arctic Weather Party, report of the following:

a. While walking alone around 1400 hours he heard a "terrific" whistling noise "like a rifle bullet", at first he thought it was a bird. After looking for the cause of the noise for about fifteen minutes he saw six to eight overhead stars (6) or seven (7) dark objects travelling very fast to the southwest direction. He watched the objects for about a half hour or longer and one-half until they disappeared out of sight to the south-southwest at an angular height of about 45 degrees from the horizontal. The objects were very high, either in the clouds or above the clouds, so far away at great distance that it was difficult to tell their size or color. They were moving in a close, tight formation except that one object went out to move out from the formation and then back into the formation at a fast periodic rate. The course of the objects was to the southwest, then left into the south-southwest. The noise diminished as the objects disappeared out of sight in the clouds.

b. The following weather conditions prevailed at the time of sighting: Visibility on surface - 10 miles; low, heavy clouds forming at 10,000 feet and at 15,000 to 20,000 feet with occasional clear skies appearing through breaks in clouds, light northeast airs.

c. Mr. [REDACTED] returned to camp and reported the above immediately following the disappearance of the objects.

2. Weather Bureau observers at Point Barrow, Alaska sighted the same shiny object through a theodolite at 2740L on the 20th of July. The object was estimated to be at an altitude of between 50,000 to 60,000 feet, moving horizontally, with no vertical movement noticeable. The object was first seen at 318° and moved from 318° to 326° in eight (8) minutes. All weather observers viewed the object through the theodolites, the object still being in view at 272330L. The weather at the time was 15,000 feet overcast, fifteen (15) miles visibility with breaks in the overcast.

COMMENTS of Preparing Officer:

This office was unable to contact Mr. [REDACTED] for further interrogation, due to the inaccessibility of Tivariak Island, but Lt. Jones who submitted the report found Mr. [REDACTED] to be an honest, dependable employee. This is his second year in the Arctic. After a review of all available information it is the opinion of this office that the object sighted at Point Barrow was the planet "Venus".

The following additional information is submitted concerning [REDACTED] served thirty-two (32) months as head cook in the United States Army at Fort [REDACTED] during April 1942. His position with the Coast and Geodetic Survey entitled him to considerable responsibility for the procurement of supplies as related to his position as head cook for the party and keeping all records. Several other members of the Coast and Geodetic Survey party stationed at [REDACTED] Florida were interviewed and verified Mitchell's reliability.
