1. [REDACTED] Civilian Air Force Police employed at this station and residing at [REDACTED] ornia, reported the following information concerning a peculiar aerial observation he experienced:

- a. Time object sighted: Approximately 1420 PST
15 July 1949.
- b. Direction of travel: northeast
- c. Estimated altitude of object: twice altitude
which two jet propelled aircraft which were
flying opposite direction at time object sighted.
- d. Estimated speed of object: greatly in excess of
any jet aircraft ever observed previously by wit-
nesses.
- e. Behavior of object: appeared as mirror reflecting
light, as though wobbling. Shape of object could
not be determined. Object observed only for a few
seconds.
- f. Other witnesses: [REDACTED] Civilian Air
Force Police, McClellan AFB.

2. This information cannot be evaluated at this installation; however, in view of the fact these Air Force Police are not given to exaggeration, it is believed the information was accurately repeated to this office.
