On 27 July 1968, [REDACTED], salesman, Sears-Roebuck and Company, residence, [REDACTED] Louisville, Kentucky, was interviewed regarding "FLYING DISC" and substance in substance:

At approximately 2100, 27 July 1968, while standing in front of my residence, my attention was attracted to a peculiar and unknown object high in the atmosphere. I was unable to estimate the approximate altitude, but this object was much higher than any airplane I have ever observed. The shape was spherical, size comparable to a large star, color was a reddish glow which varied as though there was an exhaust attached. The object was traveling in a northeasterly direction. It stopped for short intervals and then would continue in a zig-zag course. I could not be exact in judging the speed, but it must have been greater than the speed of sound, because I first sighted it directly over my home and lost it beyond the horizon about one minute later. There was no audible sound.
