SYNOPSIS

Interview of Mr. [REDACTED] Bloomington, Wisconsin, relative to his sighting of an unidentified aerial object requested by T.I.K from 5th District CSI, Wright-Patterson AFB, dated 26 November 1949. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he sighted an unidentified aerial object at approximately 1500 hours on 19 August 1949, while travelling in his automobile with his wife in Glenn Haven Township, Grant County, Wisconsin. He stated the object was travelling in a northerly direction at a height of normal aircraft at a speed of from 200 to 300 miles per hour. He described the object as exceedingly shiny, resembling a mirror with wing-like appendages. The diameter of the body appeared to be one foot, the length of the wing-like appendages, 10 inches, and their width one inch. DETAILS:

1. This investigation is predicated on a T.M from the 5th District OSI, Wright-Patterson AFB, dated 26 November 1949, requesting an interview with Mr. ██████████, Bloomington, Wisconsin, relative to an unidentified aerial object sighted by him.

AT BLOOMINGTON, WISCONSIN.

2. Mr. and Mrs. ██████████, Bloomington, Wisconsin, were jointly interviewed on 29 November 1949. Mr. ██████████ stated that on or about 19 August 1949 he and his wife went for a short drive in the country. At approximately 1500 hours, while driving his automobile in a northerly direction near the ██████████ farm in Glenn Haven Township, Grant County, Wisconsin, he sighted an unidentified aerial object at an elevation of approximately 45° from his vehicle. He immediately called this unconventional object to the attention of his wife who also fleetingly viewed it. ██████████ stated that he is not familiar with methods of computing aerial height and therefore could not accurately judge the height in terms of feet, but estimated the object as being at the level of flight, or possibly a little higher, of an aircraft in normal travel conditions. He stated the object was travelling in a horizontal plane at an even keel, in a direct northerly direction and possibly veering a little to the east at an estimated speed of from two to three hundred miles per hour. He stated that no propulsion was visible, that the object appeared stable and that he could hear no exhaust or noise and that it gradually faded from view. The weather conditions were described as a clear, bright day. In describing the object, ██████████ stated that the body had the appearance of a round shiny mirror, approximately one foot in diameter with wing-like appendages, rudders or bars extending at approximately 10 inches on either side of the body. He described the width of the wing-like appendages as approximately one inch. A diagram of the object follows:

[REDACTED] stated that the outstanding thing he noticed about the object was its brightness, which caused considerable glare in his eyes. [REDACTED] further stated that thereafter he returned to Bloomington, Wisconsin and did not give the incident further thought until he read a weekly newsletter from U. S. Representative GARDNER WITROW, member of Congress from his Congressional District, outlining a similar incident in Salt Lake City, Utah, which had been investigated by the United States Air Force. He thereupon felt that the incident might be of interest to the United States Air Force and wrote to the Hon. GARDNER WITROW about it.

3. [REDACTED] further stated that approximately two months later he had occasion to discuss the matter with one [REDACTED], a farmer residing near Bloomington, who in the discussion informed him that in late September or October, he heard a loud passing noise, but could not see any airplane or anything in the sky. He stated that he wondered if it was in any way connected with the aerial object he had viewed.

4. Mr. [REDACTED] is the [REDACTED] of the [REDACTED] in Bloomington, Wisconsin, whose population is between 700 and 800 people. He has no pertinent hobbies, and his ability to determine and reliability appear to be good. Both Mr. [REDACTED] and his wife appear to be quite intelligent.

AT GLENN HAVEN TOWNSHIP, GRANT COUNTY, WISCONSIN.

5. Mr. [REDACTED], who is a farmer in Glenn Haven Township, Grant County, Wisconsin, was interviewed relative to his discussion of an unexplained loud noise with Mr. [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that either the last Saturday in September or the first Saturday in October he and his two brothers were working in the fields. While so doing, they heard a loud passing noise from the sky. Although it was a clear day, [REDACTED] stated that he could see nothing in the sky. He described the noise as very unusual and that it did not resemble that of a plane or group of planes. He stated that one day he happened to talk to Mr. [REDACTED] and when Mr. [REDACTED] related the description of the aerial object he had seen, he brought up the subject of the unexplained noise, wondering whether it had any connection. He was unable to give any further information.


