

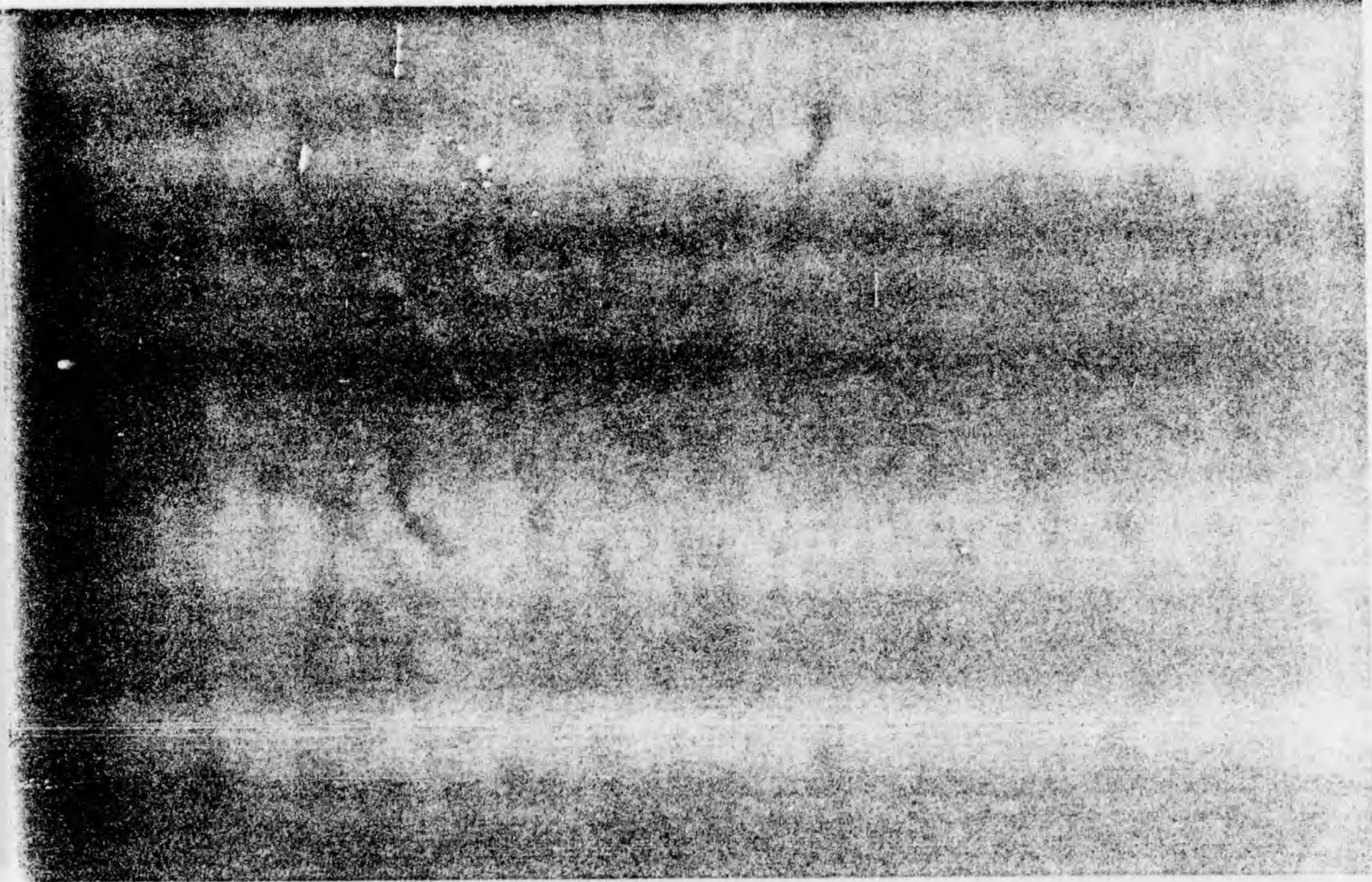

1. An unidentified lighted flying object was observed from Sandia Base, 13 March, 1949 at 2153 hours.

Both men were on sentry post at time of observation.

Sandia Base, AEC, Tech. Area.

(c) TIME OF SIGHTING:

13 March, 1949 at 2153 hours.

(f) OBJECT SIGHTED:

- (1) Number: One.
- (2) Shape: As a ball with tail of fire.
- (3) Size: Compared to full moon then in sky, about one half as large.
- (4) Color: Blue white or greenish white with white center.
- (5) Speed: Undetermined except slower than falling star.
- (6) Heading: Not determined except directly toward or directly away from observers in a descending path. Was observed in northeast horizon beyond range of Sandia Mountains, at 20° angle in the sky from observer's station.
- (7) Manueverability: None observed.
- (8) Altitude: 20° angle from observers.
- (9) Sound: None.
- (10) Exhaust trail: Object trailed flaming tail approximately twice length of body.
