13 March, 1949 at 2153 hours.

## (f) OBJECT SIGHTED:

(1) Number: One.

(2) Shape: As a ball with tail of fire.

(3) Size: Compared to full moon then in sky, about one half as large.

(4) Color: Blue white or greenish white with white center.

(5) Speed: Undetermined except slower than falling star.

(6) Heading: Not determined except directly toward or directly away from observers in a descending path. Was observed in northeast horizon beyond range of Sandia Mountains, at 20° angle in the sky from observer's station.

(7) Maneuverability: None observed.

(8) Altitude: 20° angle from observers.

(9) Sound: None.

(10) Exhaust trail: Object trailed flaming tail approximately twice length of body.
