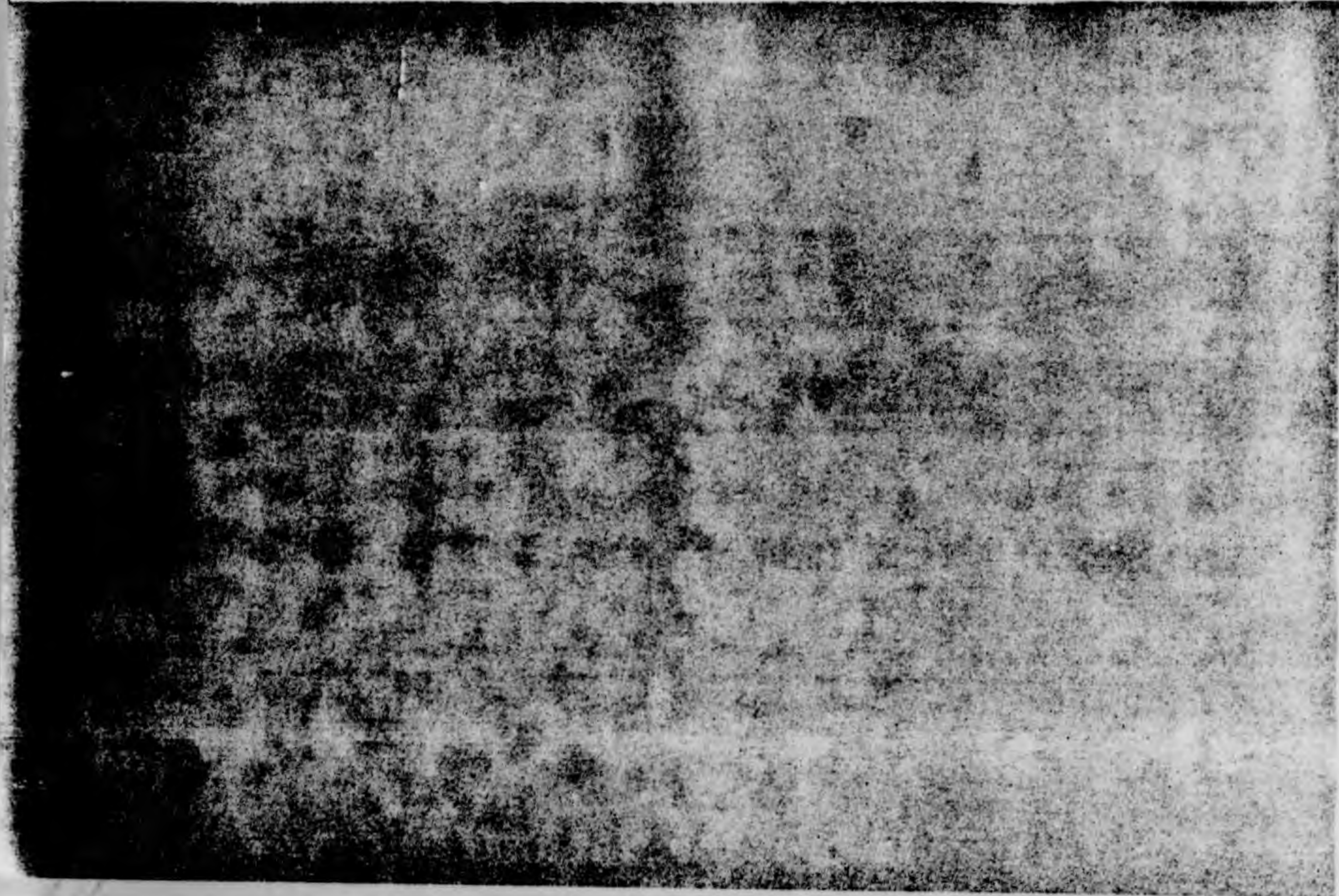

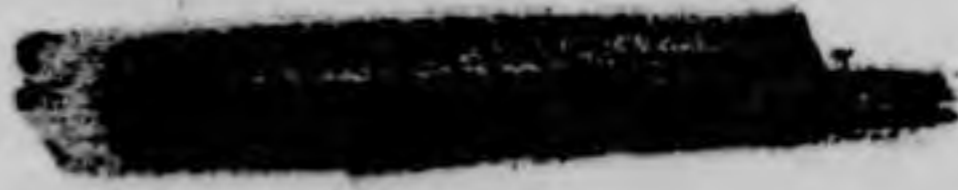

SYNOPSIS

This investigation submitted in compliance with AFCSI Letter No. 85, dated 12 August 1949, to report all sightings of unidentified flying objects. Major WILLIAM J. HAYNOR, AO-341555, Air Provost Marshal, Holloman AFB, observed an unusual aerial phenomenon at 1135 hours, 5 March 1950, along with five (5) other witnesses. All pertinent information was obtained from Major HAYNOR and is reported herein. Movie film taken by Photo Lab personnel is retained by District Office No. 17.
