(10) Exhaust Trail: Vapor trail, exhaust or stream of light was cigar shaped, approximately 200' to 300' long and silver in color.

g. General Remarks: Object was in view for approximately two and a half to three minutes. Guests called from inside M/Sgt [REDACTED] house remarked on the duration and appearance of light bursts. Witnesses, while viewing the object attempted to estimate speed and altitude but, in the dark and silence, had no basis for comparison. The witnesses are considered completely reliable and their information is confirmed by other sources.
