1. This District Office is in receipt of a letter from Mr. Paul J. Shine, Special Agent in Charge, Federal Bureau of Investigation at Albany, New York, which is quoted for your information:

"Miss [redacted] of [redacted], Tele-  
phone [redacted] advised this office on July 14, 1951, that  
she and members of her family had observed two silver  
objects in the sky, appearing to be southwest of Rensselaer,  
New York, at approximately 2:00 PM on this date.

"Miss [redacted] stated that they had maneuvered in the  
sky for approximately five minutes, had come down quite  
low, and then disappeared high into the sky. She could  
not describe these objects, other than that they did not  
appear to be airplanes.

"No investigation is contemplated by this office, and  
this information is forwarded to you for any action you  
deem advisable"
