

REPORT OF UNIDENTIFIED OBJECT SIGHTED BY LT. [REDACTED] AND WIFE

Alexandria, Virginia . 19 August 1951

Time: 1805 EDT

Wind: Surface SSW/12; 1000 190/13; 5000 220/15; 10,000 310/15 (Anacostia NAS 1600 EST)

Description of Object Sighted: A "frosty" silvery football-shaped object with its longitudinal axis parallel to the ground. Off-hand estimate of size at time of sighting 50 feet along longitudinal axis and 20 feet vertical axis.

Shape: Elliptical, or football, shaped. Shape did not change.

Position When First Sighted: Time 1805--appeared to be about 2 miles southeast of Masonic Memorial in Alexandria and about 3--4 miles from observer.

Apparent Altitude: 2000 to 4000 feet. Steady.

Elevation: 5-7° decreasing slightly as object appeared to move into distance.

Course: Away from, and to the right of observer, estimated 155° true.

Position When Last Sighted: Time 1807--estimated 10 to 12 miles further away based on approximate visibility of 20 miles. Lost sight of object when we turned off of King Street to go up Masonic Memorial hill for a better look. Arrived in clear area on top of hill at 1807plus 45 seconds, but unable to sight object again.

Unusual Characteristics: Unusual in that the object did not change its reflection as it moved through the sunlight. No wings. No tail surfaces or other protuberances. No vapor trail. No smoke or other sign of propulsion. No apparent noise.

Summary: This object appeared to be progressing along a controlled flight path at a constant altitude. Its angular decrease in elevation is believed to be due to its disappearing into the distance toward the horizon since its size appeared to decrease at the same time. It did not behave like a balloon. It did not look like any form of aircraft known to the observer.

AN UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT WAS SIGHTED
NEAR ALEXANDRIA VIRGINIA, AT 1805 EDT, 19
AUG 51, BY ~~REDACTED~~, USN, AND
HIS WIFE. THIS OBJECT WAS DESCRIBED AS A

"FROSTY SILVERY" OVAL-SHAPED
OBJECT OF APPROXIMATELY 50 FEET IN LENGTH
TRAVELING AT HIGH SPEED AT 2,000-4,000 FEET.
LT. ~~REDACTED~~ REPORTED THE SIGHTING TO THE COMMAND
POST AT THE PENTAGON.

IT SEEMED LIKELY THAT THE OBSERVATION WAS A
REFLECTION OF THE SUB'S RAYS FROM AN AIRCRAFT
FLYING AT AN ALTITUDE OF 6,000 FEET TO 15,000
FEET AND A SPEED OF 150 MILES PER HOUR TO
425 MILES PER HOUR, DEPENDING UPON THE
DISTANCE THE OBJECT FROM THE OBSERVER.
THE REPORTED "APPARENT ALTITUDE OF 2,000 FEET-
4,000 FEET" IS JUDGED TO BE INCORRECT,
CONSIDERING THE OTHER OBSERVATIONS MADE BY
LT. ~~REDACTED~~. THIS INTERVIEW WAS
CONDUCTED BY LT COL M.D. WILLIS. AFOIN-V/TC.

2. Details of the sightings and sketches of the sightings are forwarded for analysis and file. The signed statement made by LT. [REDACTED], USN, is a summary of his observations.




ANGULAR ELEVATION






