<p>AN OBJECT WAS SIGHTED IN THE SKY BY THE NAVY AIR STATION ON WHIDBEY ISLAND, WASHINGTON AT 1101 PST 16 OCT. 1951. THREE F-94 AIRCRAFT AIRBORNE ON A LOCAL MISSION WERE SENT TO INVESTIGATE. THE FIGHTER AIRCRAFT SIGHTED THE OBJECT AND FLEW TOWARD IT FOR A PERIOD OF FIFTY MINUTES. THE OBJECT WAS ABOVE THEM AND DID NOT CHANGE IN SIZE AS THEY FLEW WEST.</p> <p>A NAVIGATOR FROM THE 62ND TROOP CARRIER GROUP CALCULATED THE POSITION OF VENUS FROM THE FIGHTERS POSITION AT THAT TIME AND DATE. THE POSITION OF THE OBJECT WAS WITHIN FIVE DEGREES OF WHERE VENUS WAS CALCULATED TO BE.</p> <p>THE REPORTING OFFICER'S OPINION IS THAT THE OBJECT SIGHTED WAS THE PLANET VENUS.</p>

- A. THE SHAPE OF THE SIGHTED OBJECT WAS ROUND OR SPHERICAL, AND A LITTLE SMALLER THAN THE SIZE OF A DIME. THE COLOR WAS A MEDIUM GRAY AND THERE WAS BUT ONE OBJECT. THERE WERE NO OTHER DESCRIPTIVE FEATURES. THE OBJECT DID NOT DISAPPEAR. THE FIGHTER PILOTS HAD IT IN VIEW FOR A PERIOD OF 50 MINUTES.
- B. ORIGINAL SIGHTING WAS BY NAVAL AIR STATION AT 1101 PACIFIC STANDARD TIME. LAST SIGHTING WAS AT 1317 WHEN THE PILOTS ABANDONED CHASE TO RETURN TO BASE.
- C. ORIGINAL SIGHTING FROM GROUND WAS VISUAL. THE FIGHTER PILOTS FLYING F-94's SIGHTED THE OBJECT AND THEIR ELEVATIONS VARIED FROM 31,000 TO 46,000 FT. SPEED WAS 150 KNOTS. THE ORIGINAL PICK UP BY NAVAL AIR STATION WHIDBEY ISLAND WAS MADE WITH A THEODOLITE.
- D. THE FIGHTERS FIRST SIGHTED THE OBJECT AT $47^{\circ}N45'$ $123^{\circ}W30'$. FLEW WEST OVER OLYMPIC MOUNTAINS AND THEN OVER PACIFIC OCEAN TO $126^{\circ}W59'$ $46N38"$ WHERE THEY BROKE OFF AND RETURNED TO BASE. THE OBJECT WAS ALWAYS WEST OF THE FIGHTER AIRCRAFT AND WAS CONSIDERABLY HIGHER. AT 1245 PST ONE PILOT WAS ON A HEADING OF 216° MAGNETIC-FLYING AT 31,000 FT. (GEOGRAPHICAL POSITION OF AIRCRAFT WAS 15 MILES S.E. OF ELMA WASHINGTON), OBJECT WAS ABOVE HIM, BUT NO ESTIMATE OF DISTANCE WAS POSSIBLE.
- E. OBSERVERS WERE FOUR FIGHTER PILOTS. A MAJOR, TWO CAPTAINS AND A 1st LT.
- F. THE WEATHER WAS CLEAR AND THE WINDS AT 40,000 FT. DURING THIS PERIOD WERE FROM 310° 60 KNOTS.
- G. THE PLANET VENUS IS VISIBLE IN THIS AREA DURING THIS PERIOD.
- H. PICTURES TAKEN FROM THE FIGHTER AIRCRAFT SHOW THE OBJECT.
- I. THE FIGHTER AIRCRAFT FOLLOWED THE OBJECT IN A WESTERLY DIRECTION, BUT OBJECT SEEMED TO REMAIN IN THE SAME POSITION AND THE SAME DISTANCE AWAY.
- J. THE THREE F-94's WERE AIRBORNE AT TIME SIGHTING WAS REPORTED AND THEY WERE SENT IN DIRECTION OF THE FLYING OBJECT. THEY FLEW ABOUT 100 MILES OFF THE COAST AND THERE WERE NO OTHER AIRCRAFT IN THAT VICINITY.
