




1. Phenomena noted Palmer, Alaska when sun going down, to Southwest of Palmer bluish light visible about 30 min. First stood perpendicular about 10, 15 min, then slowly tilted to long, pen and slid off to East. Obj no bright stood out against setting sun. Obj described as resembling halo of fluorescent light tube, two ft long, very bright blue, unif bright all over.

EXTRACT FROM STATUS REPORT # 6

DESCRIPTION OF INCIDENT: Sources observed long tube-like, bright blue object, near the setting sun. During the observation the object shifted from a horizontal to a vertical position.

Report forwarded to A-2, HQADS, from AFSAU G-2 Detachment, substantially as follows:

a. Alaska Railroad Special Agent, [REDACTED], informed AFSAU that Special Agent Nelson, Alaska Railroad, at Willow, Alaska, had reported peculiar object in that vicinity during afternoon 7 January 1962.

b. Investigation revealed Agent Nelson had received actual information from his wife.

c. Questioned by telephone on same date, Mrs. Nelson stated that she and four (4) or five (5) other women first noticed a peculiar object in the sky between 1430 and 1530 hours 7 January. The object was described as resembling half a fluorescent light tube, two (2) feet long, very bright blue with uniform color throughout. It remained perpendicular for ten (10) to fifteen (15) minutes and then slowly tilted to a horizontal position. The women watched it for about thirty (30) minutes. During this time it changed position slightly, moving north and downward from the sun. This change in position was noticed only by judging the object's location in comparison to the tree line.

During the entire observation, Mrs. Nelson reported the object was located to the north-side of the sun, with a brightness equal to that of the sun. Mrs. Nelson believed it did not appear as distant as the sun and felt it might be more object over Almedorf AFB, approximately forty (40) air miles to the southwest. Mrs. Nelson said she did not see the object disappear from sight.

d. None of the others who witnessed the object were immediately available for interview by telephone.

e. Alaska Air Command informed and will take further investigative action.

f. Additional data will be forwarded when available.


