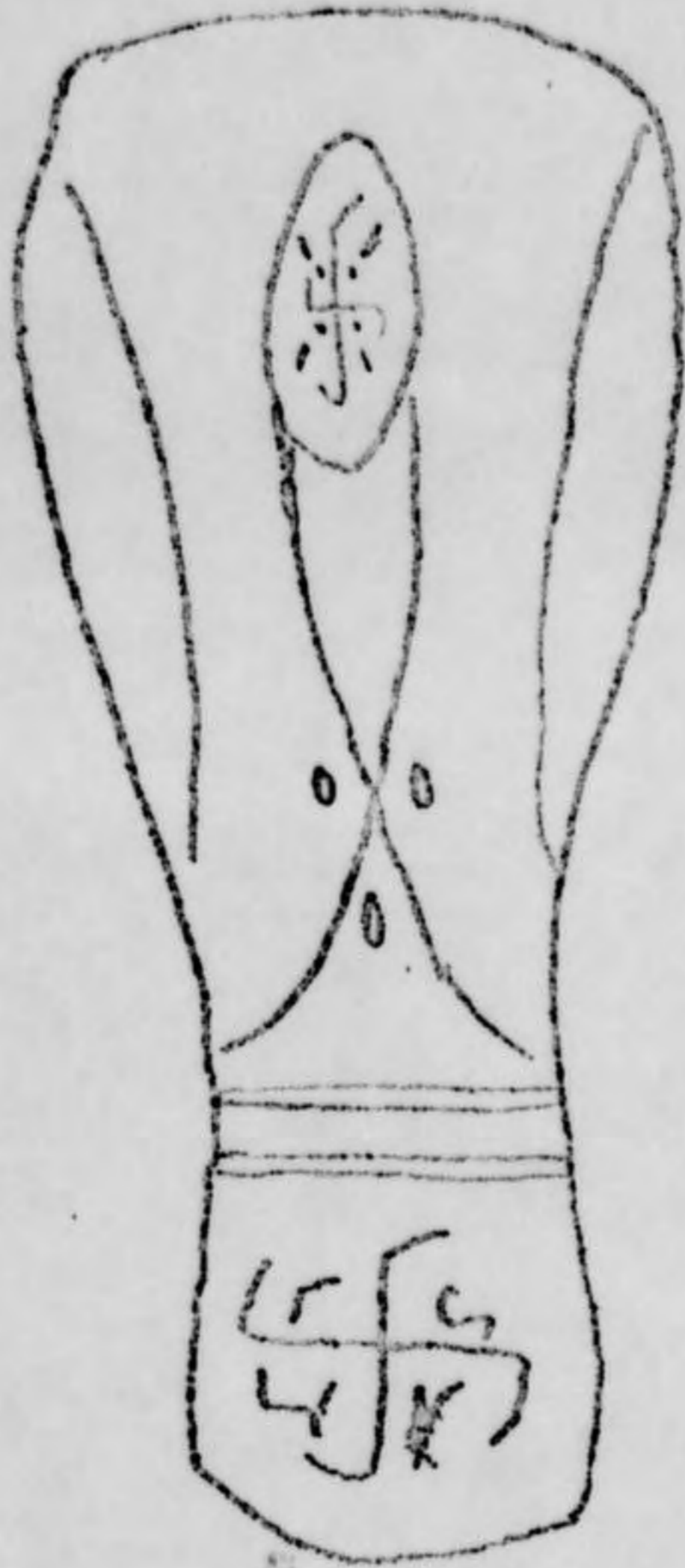
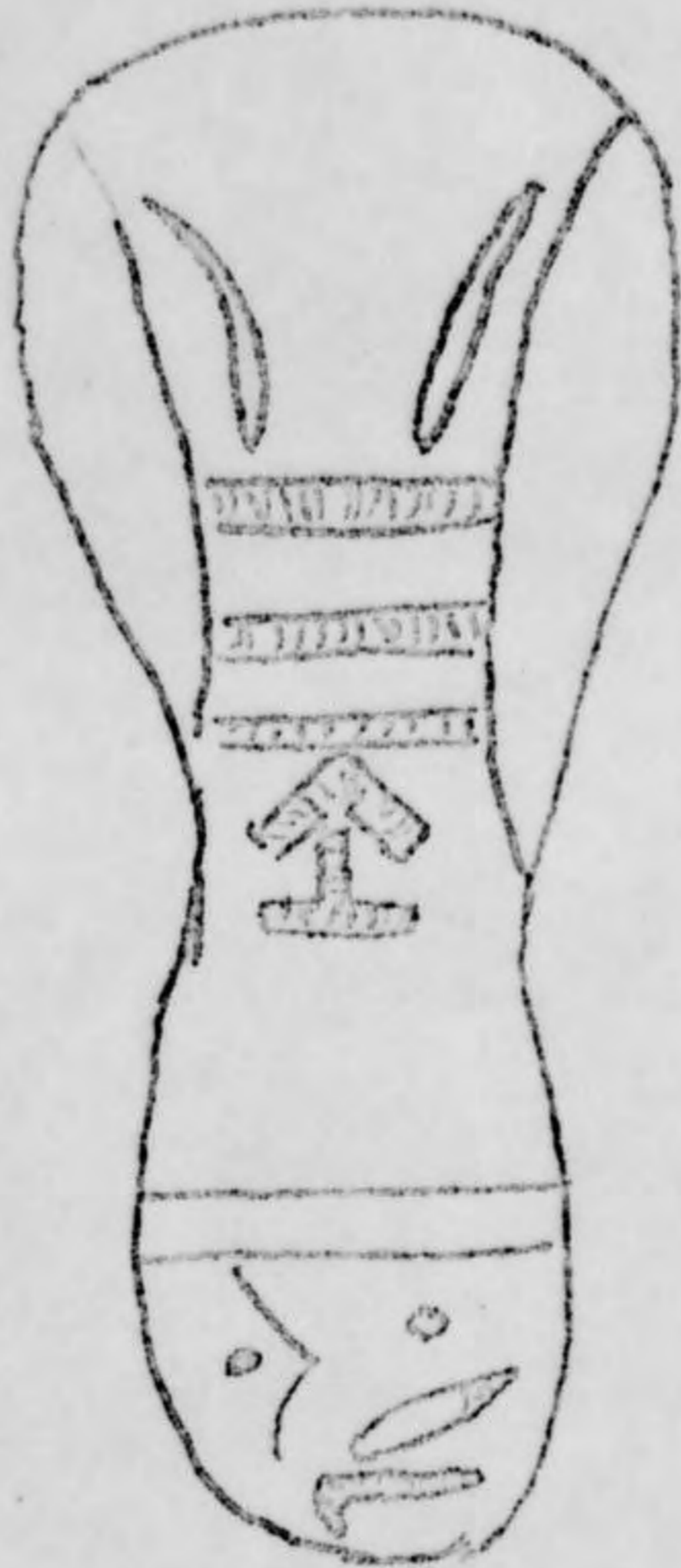

Report forwarded to 4-2, USAAG, from 48741 OIC Detachment, substantially as follows:

a. Alaska Railroad Special Agent, [REDACTED], informed OIC that Special Agent Nelson, Alaska Railroad, at Fairbanks, Alaska, had reported peculiar aerial object in that vicinity during afternoon 7 January 1958.

b. Investigation revealed Agent Nelson had received actual information from his wife.

c. Questioned by telephone on same date, Mrs. Nelson stated that she and four (4) or five (5) other women first noticed a peculiar object in the sky between 1400 and 1500 hours 7 January. The object was described as resembling half a fluorescent light tube, two (2) feet long, very bright blue with uniform color throughout. It remained perpendicular for ten (10) to fifteen (15) minutes and then slowly tilted to a horizontal position. The women watched it for about thirty (30) minutes. During this time it changed position slightly moving north and downward from the sun. This change in position was noticed only by judging the object's location in comparison to the tree line.

During the entire observation, Mrs. Nelson reported the object was located to the north-side of the sun, with a brightness equal to that of the sun. Mrs. Nelson believed it did not appear as distant as the sun and felt it might be some object over Alondorf AFB, approximately forty (40) air miles to the southwest. Mrs. Nelson said she did not see the object disappear from sight.

d. None of the others who witnessed the object were immediately available for interview by telephone.

e. Alaska Air Command informed and will take further investigative action.

f. Additional data will be forwarded when available.

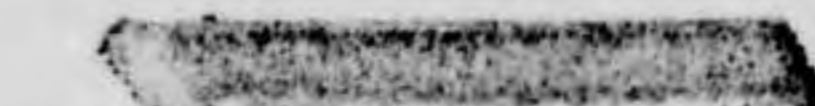

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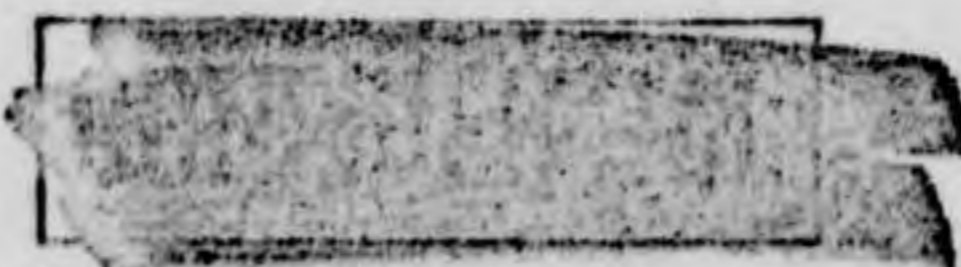

I saw this peculiar long object in the sky while coming to work this morning. I was traveling along Arlington Boulevard between Seven Corners and Arlington Hall. I'll bet a lot of others saw it, too. It looked like a long white vapor trail and very clearly defined. The end which was moving was as sharp as a needle, and the rest was like a long icicle, but it was no cloud. I could see no plane leading the vapor trail. The trail just moved on in this clearly defined horse shoe, and then continued on. I could clearly see it moving. The other end did not move.

There was no plane in the vicinity.
It was very long and quite high!
