DUTY OFFICER NOTIFIED USAF COMMAND POST  
WHO CONTACTED ADC. LATTER ADVISED THAT B-45  
FROM LANGLEY FLYING EAST TO WEST AT 38,000 FT OVER  
WASHINGTON AT 2140 HRS. CONSIDER THIS TO  
BE VERY PROBABLE EXPLANATION THIS SIGHTING.
