1. On 29 April 1952, Special Agent GEORGE L. CAREY of this District Office, received a telephone call from Mr. [REDACTED] Ohio [REDACTED] 2, Area "A", Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio.

2. [REDACTED] advised that he had been watching an unidentifiable object in the sky about 30° to the east of his residence near Beaver Creek School House, Route 35, Ohio. He watched the object with 8" x 30" binoculars and advised that it remained in one spot for approximately 45 minutes.

3. The object was described as having a brilliant red spot in the center. It glowed a brilliant red and then turned to a hazy blue.

4. The foregoing information is forwarded for your information and evaluation in accordance with letter, Department of the Air Force, AFOLC-CC-1, dated 8 September 1950, and AFCSI Letter No. 85, Headquarters, Office of Special Investigations, dated 23 October 1950.

5. It is suggested that Mr. [REDACTED] be contacted by your intelligence personnel for a detailed report.

6. No further action is contemplated by this office covering subject matter, unless otherwise requested by your office.
