- (a). One Silver Object; Shape unknown, but it did not have wings; no sound, no trail or exhaust, appeared to fly in straight line away from observer for 1 1/2 minutes.
- (b). Appeared 0512Pst for 1 1/2 minutes.
- (c). Visual surface observation.
- (d). Air Defense Grid 7 48-2730 (approximately 46° 24' N, 119° 37' W) Objects were moving in North West direction, away from observer, at 5,000ft.
- (e). Observers are adult males, reliability unknown.
- (f). Meigs Lake, Washington, 1 May 1952, 0510Pst. Clear, 50 miles visibility, temperature 44, Dew Point 39, wind South at 5 knots.
- (g). Weather Balloon, white, released at Yakima, Washington at 0115Pst.
- (h). None Available.
- (i). None taken, No Radar contacts.
- (j). Tanford Patrol Plane, call sign, "Grey-2", Pilot McFey was in vicinity.

Received a phone report from Mr. [REDACTED] on 1 May 1952. He stated 2 employees, [REDACTED] 4307788, had sighted a silver object, 5000ft high, heading North West from their position at a fairly slow air speed. They also saw the patrol plane South East of the object at the same time. No noise was heard at any time, nor were trails visible. This information was passed to Captain Wheeler, Duty Controller at 4307, 600, Hamilton Ave, California.
