

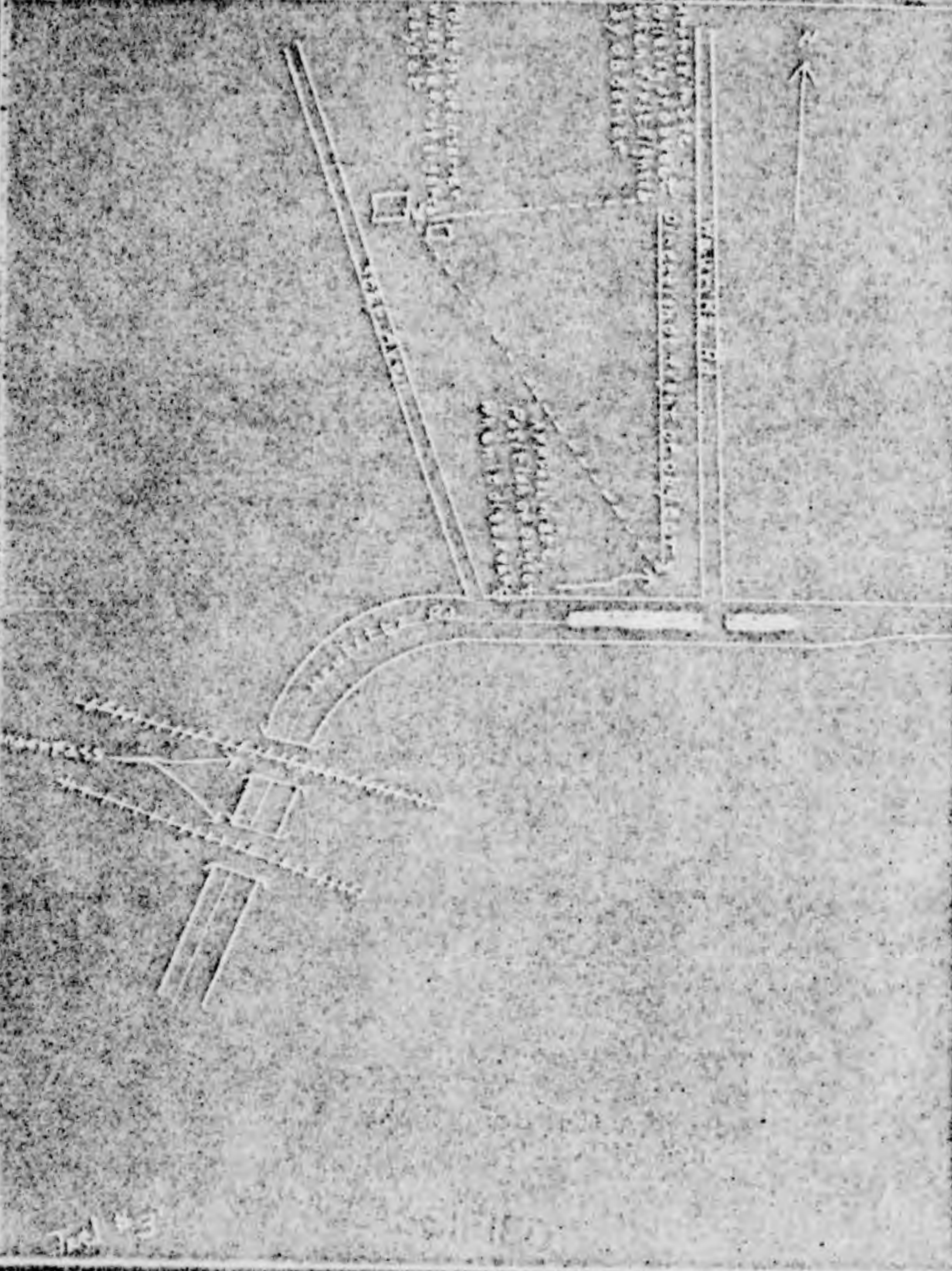

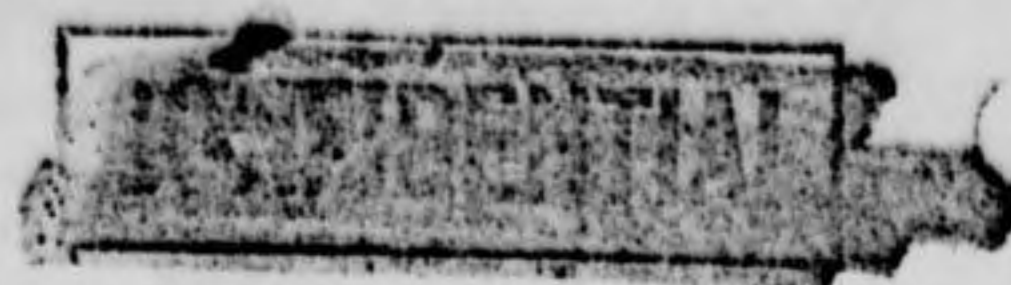

Unconventional Aerial Sighting observed at Wichita Falls, Texas during the morning of 2 May 52.

Sighting consisted of one unidentified round object traveling in a North East to South South West direction at an altitude of approximately four thousand (4,000) feet and traveling at between nine hundred (900) and one thousand (1,000) miles per hour.

Observed sighting was of a dull metal color. Observation sighting was made for approximately five (5) seconds.

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The preparing officer interviewed S Sgt [REDACTED] 35, USA (Ret.), 409 Star Ave, Wichita Falls, Texas, on 2 May 1952. The following information was received:

Subject individual stated that at 1000 hours, 2 May 1952, he saw, in flight, an object which was circular, saucer shaped, approximately eighteen (18) to twenty-four (24) feet in diameter, of a dull metal color, which was roughly seven (7) feet thick at the center and tapering to the edge, flying in an arc about one (1) mile distant from him at approximately four thousand (4,000) feet altitude and traveling at between nine hundred (900) and one thousand (1,000) miles per hour. Subject individual observed no exhaust or trail, heard no noise and did not know how object was propelled.

COMMENTS OF PREPARING OFFICER:

1. Subject individual is unknown to preparing officer. He is presently retired from the service and resides at 409 Star Ave., Wichita Falls, Texas. Information pertaining to subject individual is as follows:

a. S Sgt Steven R. Horn, R 3818735, USA (Ret.) was born 9 March 1896, at Mesquite, Texas. His religion is Baptist. He completed eight (8) years formal education. While a civilian he was a truck driver for three (3) years and has been retired from the service for approximately eight (8) years. He served twenty (20) years and seven (7) months with the US Army in various branches. His specific duties were with the Military Police when discharged. While in the service he served in the Zone of Interior, Panama Canal Zone and the Phillipine Islands.

2. Weather and Wind conditions on 2 May 1952 at 0930 hours and 1030 hours were as follows:

- a. 0930 hours:
 - High scattered clouds (10,000 feet)
 - Visibility fifteen (15) miles plus.
 - Temperature sixty-nine (69) degrees.
 - Wind from the NNE at two (2) miles per hour.
- b. 1030 hours:
 - Clear
 - Visibility fifteen (15) miles plus.
 - Temperature seventy-one (71) degrees.
 - Wind from the SE at two (2) miles per hour.
