The following is for your information and necessary action from the report of the Officers of the Day for the period beginning 0330 12 May to 0330 13 May 1952:

2145 - Received long distance telephone call as indicated below:

From: [redacted], commercial pilot, license [redacted] age 28, veteran-US Navy, Kenton, Ohio.

Reported: He had sighted an unidentified object flying NNW, altitude over 20,000 ft, estimated speed 500-600 MPH. He stated that he was familiar with jet aircraft and it was not a jet aircraft. Object was sighted over Kenton, Ohio at 2116 hours.

Action Taken: Reported to ATIC Duty Officer, telephone 64100.

2240 - Same individual called and relayed further information:

- a. No vapor trail sighted.
- b. Sky is clear and no overcast.
- c. He has sighted similiary unidentified object three (3) times since 1947.

[redacted] - 13 May - A call was received from Lt [redacted] of the WPAFB police department concerning a broken padlock in stockroom ATIST-3, Building 89. Lt D. R. [redacted], [redacted] investigated the report and confirmed that the padlock hasp had apparently been forced open. Capt. [redacted] is the officer in charge of ATIST-3.
