This report is intended to clarify and resolve two previous reports, per above and incls.

**Reference Incl 1:**

The report submitted pertaining to sighting by Mr. [redacted] has been resolved to the satisfaction of the undersigned. Mr. [redacted] made the sighting at the same time F-94B aircraft, piloted by Lts [redacted] of the 58th Ftr-Intop Sq, were in his surveillance area.

After considerable detailed conversation with these two pilots as to their tactics, etc, in attempting to intercept the object(s) they had sighted it is the opinion of the undersigned that Mr. [redacted] was tracking their aircraft. The F-94s were maneuvering in the area reported by Mr. [redacted].

The F-94s were definitely [redacted].  
Afterburners were lit, power advanced and retarded.  
Mr. [redacted] is likely unfamiliar with the appearance of the afterburner black jet fighter as it appears at night, and during maneuvers.



Reference Incl 2:

After considerable detailed conversation with the pilot making the sighting the base weather officer was conferred with.

It is the opinion of the undersigned, the base (Otis AFB) weather officer, and (now) the reporting pilot, that the object sighted and reported as unidentified was a weather pilot balloon.

Further, it is the opinion of all three that the object (resolved as a pilot balloon) was most likely released from Westover AFB, Mass.

Because of this conclusion no further report was made on the object.
