which flew between her and the object. It was too high for her to hear. I understand from a jet pilot that this distance would be approximately 35,000 ft.

It is just impossible for me to estimate any speed, as we did not time its movements. I am certain of the total elapsed time we viewed the object, and I feel almost sure the time it remained motionless after its deviation from its course was 20-30 minutes. Then it took some time for it to descend. We viewed it with the naked eye to which it was clearly visible in all its movements. At times we reclined on the ground to view it through binoculars, and it was while viewing it this way that the orange glow was clearly visible. These binoculars are Carl Zeiss-Jena 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 40. The appendage which was definitely visible to the naked eye appeared to have two spheres attached to it when viewed thru the binoculars and we presumed the explosions came from them. These explosions appeared as blots of terrific brilliance. There was no indication of sparks. EW

In accordance with Air Force Letter 200-5 dated 29 April 1952, the following information is submitted:

(1) A single disc-shaped object was observed approaching due North by Mrs. [REDACTED], her daughter, Claire, same address, Mrs. [REDACTED] and Mrs. [REDACTED], all from San Antonio, Texas. Object appeared immense to observers but no estimation of size could be given. However, Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that object appeared as large as the transit tower dome, located approximately ten miles distance in downtown San Antonio. Object emitted a brilliant, whitish, silver color, described by observer as somewhat like burning magnesium. When first sighted, object appeared to be spherical in shape but after object flipped about, it gave the appearance of an oblong disc. A pendulum-like fixture was attached to the object's underside and at times oscillated but always pointed earthward. This fixture was always visible, even when object performed flipping maneuvers. Two bulb-like knobs were fixed in-line on this pendulum-like fixture from which explosions in the form of balls of fire emitted. What appeared to be faint vapor trails were observed forming on the South side of object. No noise heard by observers. Object approached in a straight line then moved laterally a short distance East and West rapidly then continued its flight to the North until almost directly overhead of observers. Object hovered motionless in this position for twenty minutes then disappeared by a gradual ascent until no longer visible.

(2) Object first sighted 0915 hours, Central Standard Time. Length of time observed one hour and twenty minutes.

(3) A visual ground observation with binoculars was made.

(4) Observers were at residence of Mrs. [REDACTED] San Antonio, Texas at the time of the sighting. Object was in the South sky bearing North. Distance unestimated and altitude estimated at much higher than forty thousand feet.

(5) Reliability of observers unknown.

(6) Fair weather prevailed at the time of the sighting.

(7) No meteorological explanation for the sighting.

(8) No physical evidence of sighting.

(9) No interception or identification action taken.

(10) Location of any air traffic in the general area at the time of the sighting unknown.

STATEMENT

At approximately 0915 hours, Central Standard Time, 16 July 1962, I was in my garden conversing with my neighbor, Mrs. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED], when I observed a round object rise from the south sky. This object appeared to be the same size as the dome of the transiet tower. The object at first gave the impression of being a commercial advertisement being towed by an airplane and I didn't give much immediate thought so I continued my conversation with Mrs [REDACTED]

Presently a jet aircraft flew over and we began looking for the jet plane. We were joined at this time by my daughter, [REDACTED] While looking for the jet plane we noticed that the object had risen on the horizon to a point of about a forty-five degree angle. Mrs. [REDACTED]

left at this time to call another neighbor, Mrs [REDACTED] [REDACTED] to see the object. We watched it until it had traveled to a point of about a seventy degree angle. At this time I entered the house to report the object to Kelly AF Base. My daughter observed object through eight-power binoculars and noticed that the object moved East a very short distance then West and hovered a few minutes. Then the object headed North again until it was almost at mid-sky at which time it hovered approximately twenty minutes, neither moving nor performing maneuvers. The object then began to rise gradually until it was no longer visible even with the binoculars.

The object appeared to be of metallic construction and emitted

a brilliant white light, not unlike burning magnesium. At first the object appeared spherical with a pendulum-like apparatus fixed to the underside, giving the illusion of a parachute with a man hanging from it. Two bulb-like knobs were attached in-line on the pendulum-like apparatus from which explosions emitted, especially noticeable when the object flipped around. This pendulum was visible at all times even when performing the flipping maneuvers. When the object flipped around, it appeared to be more flattened, somewhat similar to the planet Saturn, except it was longer and more spread out.

As to relation of size with known objects, we observed a jet aircraft fly beneath the object and even though the object was much higher than the plane, the object appeared to be as large as the jet. The plane was estimated to be flying at between thirty-five and forty thousand feet.



It just seems to me to have been some type of aircraft as it definitely was a solid object. The extreme brilliance was pronounced when seen as a sphere; less pronounced when turning over. The flashes that were emitted were of a different type of brilliance and always appeared at one certain location in regard to the sphere; i.e., always on the south side as it traveled north. The fact that it quickly moved on its course and returned, then hung in original position for 20 minutes before gradually ascending.






