SUBJECT: Unconventional Aircraft

TO: A-2  
Selfridge Air Force Base  
Mt. Clemens, Michigan

1. A Mr. [REDACTED] Ogden Dunes, Indiana, telephoned this headquarters on 17 July 52, at approximately 1500 hours and gave the following report:

At approximately 2200 hours on 16 July he noticed a large orange-colored light in the sky moving very fast from west to east across Lake Michigan. It seemed to be about 2,000 feet high and travelled on a straight line out over the horizon. It did not zigzag as a meteor might. It was about the size of a full moon and disappeared very suddenly from sight. Another object appeared about one minute later, same description, and it too disappeared at about the same place. He was at the lake front in East Chicago, Indiana when he observed the objects.

2. This headquarters contemplates no further action in the matter.
