

At 2215 hours, 16 July 1952, Captain [redacted], acting as Airdrome Officer for McGuire Air Force Base, received a telephone call from Mrs. [redacted], [redacted],addonfield, New Jersey. Mrs. [redacted] reported the sighting of a strange unidentified object in the air by her, her husband and three small children.

The object was sighted by the [redacted] family at approximately 2050 hours as they were returning home from a pleasure drive. It was seen for ten to fifteen seconds; disappeared for approximately five seconds; reappeared and was seen for five to ten seconds before its final disappearance. It appeared to be a perfectly round sphere, composed of white light, which had no visible means of propulsion. The object was travelling west to east when suddenly it changed direction and travelled directly north. After its second disappearance the object was not seen again.

The claims made by Mrs. [redacted] were referred to the 568th Air Base Group for investigation and were investigated by S/Sgt Dennis G. Washburn, Intelligence Operations Technician. His complete report is forwarded.

Report of Investigation of Unidentified Object Sighted in the Air on
15 July 1952 at Haddonfield, N. J., by S/Sgt [redacted]

At 1100 hours, 17 July 1952, I was instructed by Major [redacted],
Operations Officer, 56th Air Base Group, to investigate an unidentified
flying object report received at 2215 hours, 15 July 1952. His instructions
contained the following letter:

56TH OPERATIONS SQUADRON

SUBJECT: Report of Flying Saucer 15 July 1952

TO: Base Operations Officer
Major [redacted]

FROM: Airframe Officer
Captain Doyle

1. At 2215 EST, a phone call was received at Base
Operations by the undersigned, relative to a sighting of a flying
saucer. The following is the account rendered by the person report-
ing said sighting.

2. An object the shape of a crystal ball, glowing
brilliantly was sighted at 2030 EST, in the vicinity of Crescent
Road, three miles east of Haddonfield New Jersey. The object was
estimated to be at an altitude of 1000 (one thousand) feet, approach-
ing from the east, toward the party making the report of sighting,
executed a sharp turn to the right, appeared to hang in mid air
momentarily, then the light disappeared, a few seconds. The light
reappeared, in the same location, then an A/C, displaying conven-
tional position lights appeared to approach towards the object at
a distance; and at this moment the lighted object (flying saucer)
again disappeared and was not again sighted. At the last sighting
the object was traveling in a northerly direction.

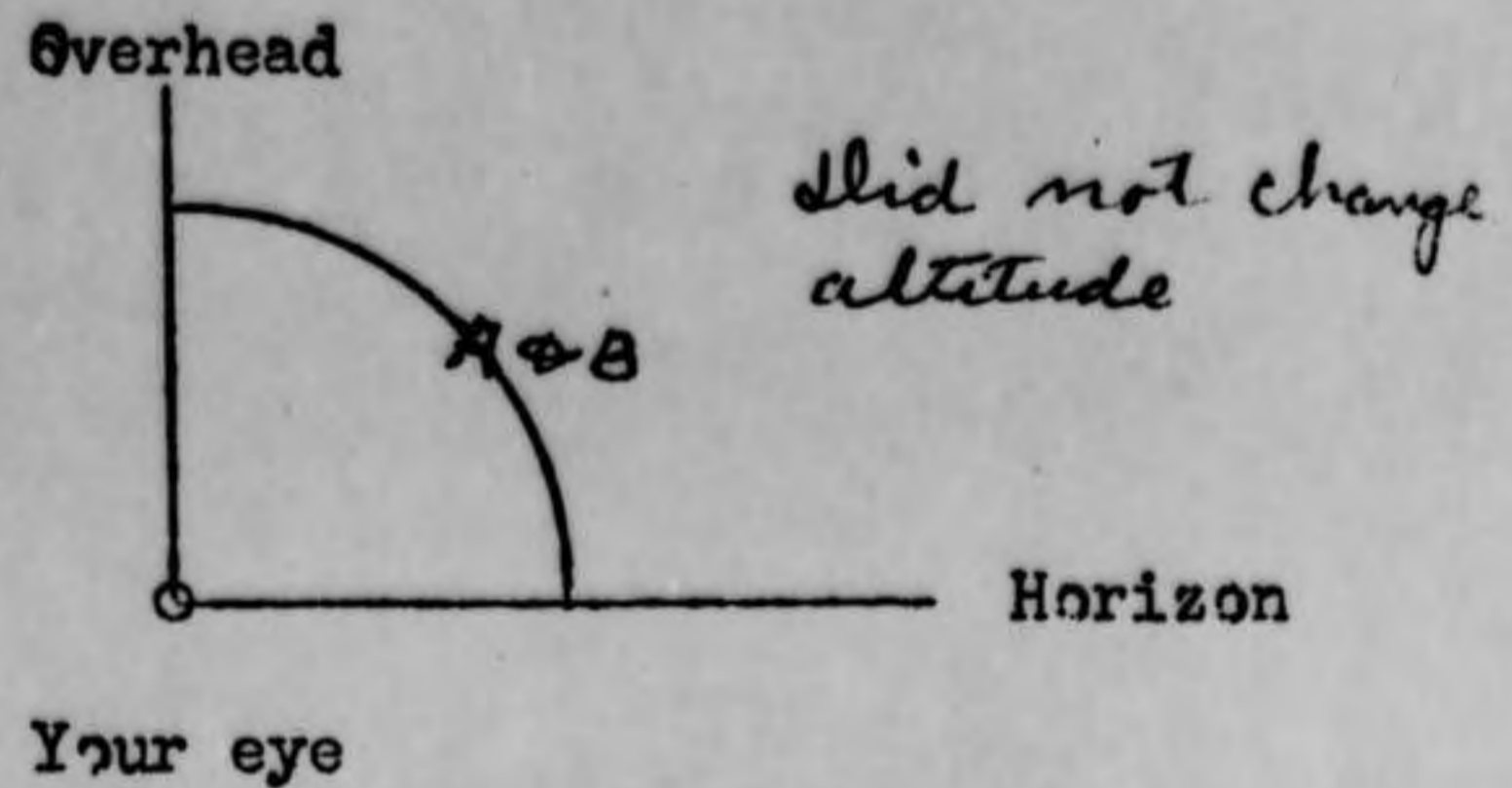

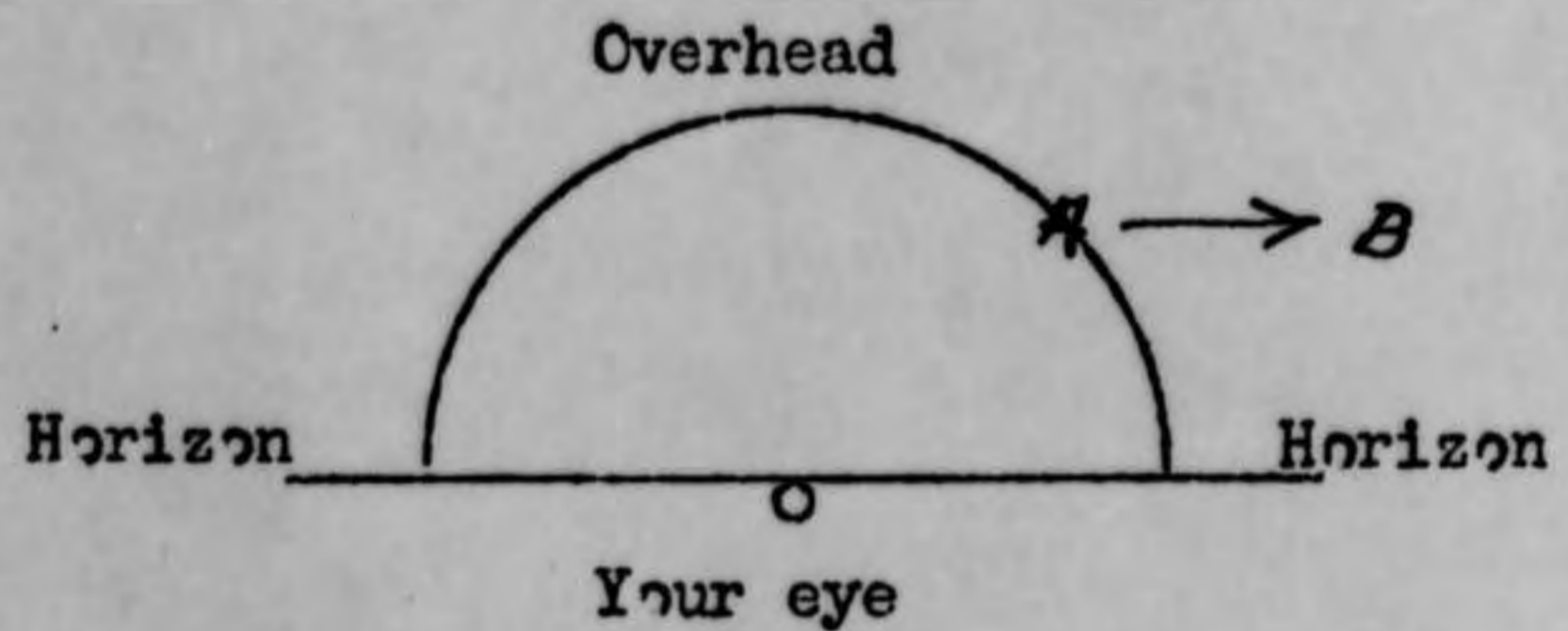
