

1. Description: Object was round in shape, color was a bright orange, as if lit up. No contrails were noted nor did the object emit sound. Object was very high in the sky and traveling at an extremely high rate of speed (no estimate was made as to approximate altitude or speed). Object was sighted at two (2) separate times; once, when the object was traveling in level flight due South for a period of less than one (1) minute--until view was obstructed by trees; again, approximately ten (10) to fifteen (15) minutes later when the object was sighted returning due North until directly overhead at which time the object veered to a Northwesterly direction, until it disappeared from sight behind trees.

2. Time: 2000L, 22 July 1962.

3. Number of Observations: Object was observed from the ground while persons were seated in front yard of home at 423 Leuning Drive, Dallas, Texas. Binoculars were used as a visual aid.

4. Location of Observer: W Long. $96^{\circ}45'$, N Lat. $32^{\circ}40'$.

5. Identifying Information on Observer: Observers were Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED] Lyle Leuning, Drive, Dallas, Texas. Observers were accompanied by their neighbors Mr and Mrs. [REDACTED], Dallas, Texas, also listed as an observer is [REDACTED] nephew [REDACTED] Kerrville, Texas. Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED] appear to be persons of average intelligence. Mr. [REDACTED] employed by the Red Bull Motor Freight Lines of Dallas as a trucker.

7. Other Activity: No other activity was reported to this Headquarters from this area.

8. Physical Evidence: No physical evidence or photographs were retained.




