| <p style="text-align: right;">0935 Z</p> <p>An unidentified object was observed visually at 0235 Pacific Daylight Time for approximately one minute, 2 August 1952. It was described as a very bright light, three times as bright as a star. The object was not moving. The observer stated that it could not be a light on a building. The altitude was estimated only as very high.</p> <p>The observer was located at California and Powell Street in San Francisco, California. The object was to the northwest of the observer at an 85° angle. The observer's name is Miss Marguerite Colvin, 215 Cole Street, San Francisco. She stated that the stars and moon were not showing because of a high fog layer.</p> <p>The weather officer reported winds at 10,000 feet were 160° at 9 knots; at 20,000 feet winds were at 200° at 23 knots.</p> <p>Meteorological activity, physical evidence of the sighting, identification action taken and aircraft in the area were reported as negative.</p> <p><u>Comments of Preparing Officer:</u></p> <p>1.
