An unidentified object was observed visually at 0420 Pacific Daylight Time, (2 August 1952.) It was observed for a period of 4 minutes. The object was described as a glowing bright light, becoming very brilliant. It was moving slowly. It was first observed to the East of the observer, the object was traveling to the North, then it traveled South for approximately 2 miles, then it traveled back to the North. The altitude was estimated as very low. No audible sounds were reported.

The observer was located at a GOC Post in Chico, California, Geo. Ref. PK 1043. The observer is Mr. Robert C. Kavman, 478 Walnut Street, Apt. 97, Chico, California.

The weather officer reports winds at 10,000 feet at 140° at 7 knots and at 20,000 feet winds were 170° at 21 knots.

Meteorological activity, physical evidence of the sighting, identification action taken and aircraft in the area were reported as negative.
