An unidentified object was first observed visually at 1315 Pacific Daylight Time, 7 August 1952. It was sighted again at 1400 Pacific Daylight Time, and a third time at 1515 PDT. It was observed approximately for five minutes each time. It was described as a round disk resembling a ball, silver in color, and it had an estimated speed from 50 to 70 miles per hour. No audible sounds were reported. At first it was on an irregular course, later straightening out in a northerly direction. The object was estimated at an altitude of 15,000 feet.

The observers, [REDACTED], [REDACTED] Santa Rosa, California, telephone [REDACTED] and Mrs. [REDACTED], Santa Rosa, California, were located at GOC Post in Santa Rosa, California. Gee. Ref. NJ 1725. The object appeared to be 4 miles northwest of the GOC Post.

The weather was reported as very clear with winds Southwest to Northeast at 15 miles per hour.

Meteorological activity, physical evidence of the sighting, identification action taken, and aircraft in the area, were reported as negative.
