An unidentified object was observed visually at 1045 Pacific Daylight Time, 4 August 1952. It was described as a large dial like object. Speed, sounds, color, and altitude were not reported.

The object was over the city of San Francisco, California. The observer's name is Mrs. [redacted] and [redacted], San Francisco, California, Telephone Beaflight 12056.

The weather officer reports the area clear with winds at 10,000 feet at 170° at 10 knots, 20,000 feet at 210° at 24 knots.

Meteorological activity, physical evidence of the sighting, identification actions taken and aircraft in the area are reported as negative.
