An unidentified object was observed visually at 2032 Pacific Daylight Time, 5 August 1952. It was described as having a tail of fire approximately one mile long and bright red in color. The object was traveling in a northerly direction at an altitude of about 10,000 feet.

The observer, Mr. Howell I. Cletus, Box 47, Berkeley, California, was located at a G.O.C. Post near Clear Lake, California. Geo. Ref. NK 1200.

The weather officer reports the area clear with a visibility of 25 miles. Winds at 10,000 feet were 190° at 9 knots; at 20,000 feet winds were 200° at 19 knots.

One F-94 that was in the air was vectored to the area of the sighted object. Negative findings.

Meteorological activity, physical evidence of the sightings and aircraft in the area were reported as negative.
