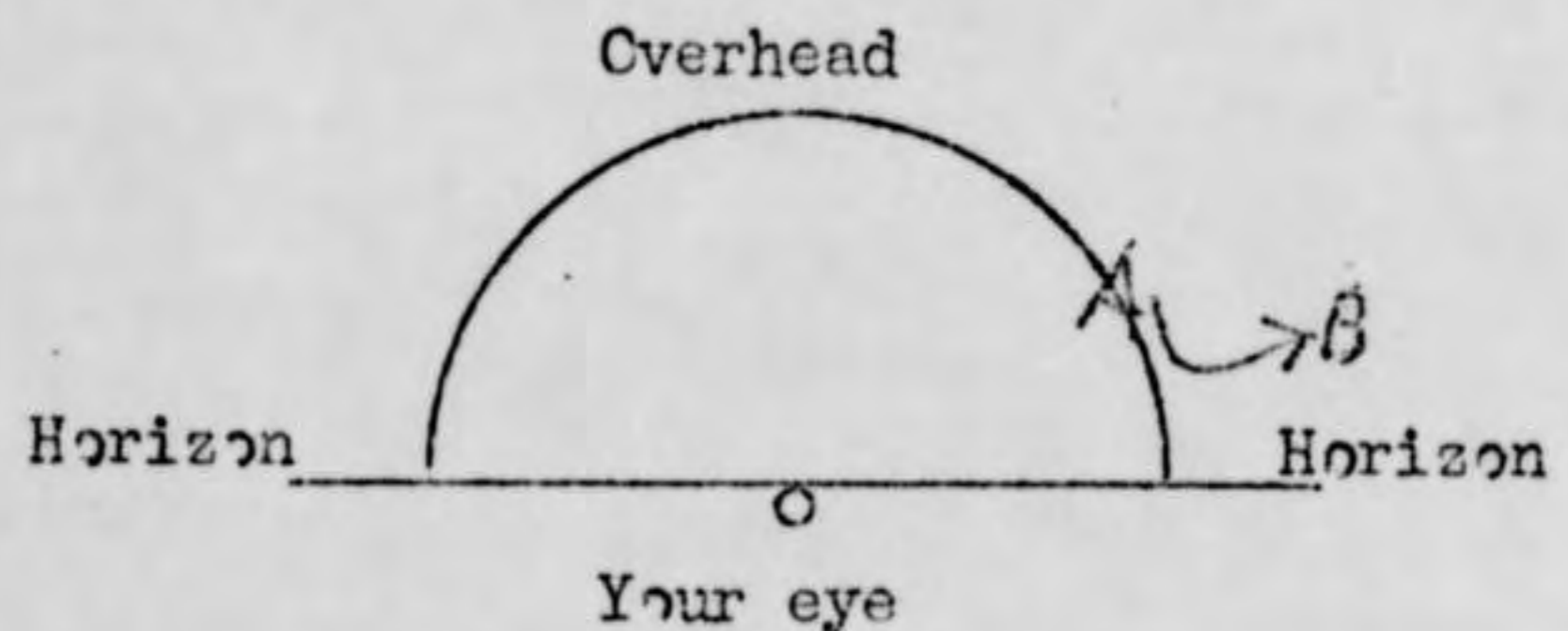

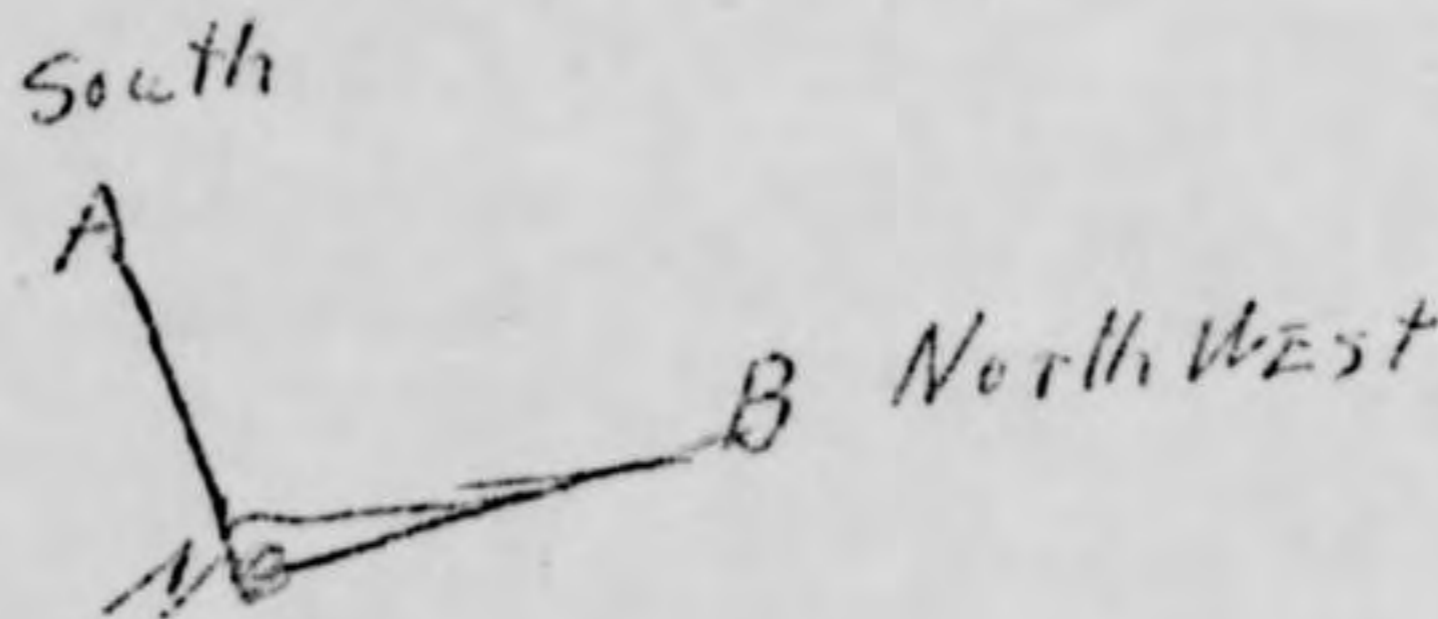

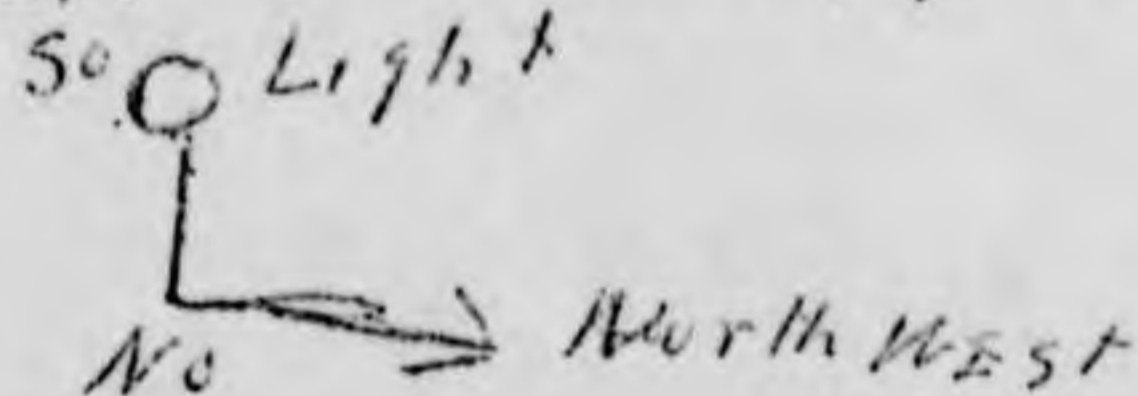

DEAR Sirs:- In my own way I will try to explain. AM not sure as to the date Aug 7th. But AM sure you could find out from Selfridge Field if you want that information. But as to the time I AM sure as to what I put down in this report. About 11-30 PM A [REDACTED] myself started to get ready to retire. We had a light lunch went to bed room to change clothes, then to bath room then just before going to bed Both [REDACTED] I went to kitchen to get a cigarette. I looked at the time & was just past midnight. I walked to the front of the house & sat down ⁱⁿ front of the big window looking out. My wife came in & stood in front of the window & we both noticed the light. We thought it a big or huge star. But as we watched it would sort of jump up & down & at times it would sort of turn to one side & when it did it

Would have a sort of a reddish cast. We could see no shape only the light. We watched through the window for a while & then went out on the front porch. The lights seemed the same. We finally decided to call Selfridge Field when the light moved to the right which is north & moved very slow could hardly see it move. After it moved north it seemed to stop & go north west which would be directly away from us. While I was on the phone talking to Selfridge field ~~Mr. [redacted] (V. [redacted])~~ stood there for a minute or so & I walked to the door to see where the light was. It was gone. She came back & told me & I repeated same to the officer I was talking to. I hope I have made this clear & of service to you. It's pretty hard to describe something when all you can see is light & when in the air hard to judge distance.

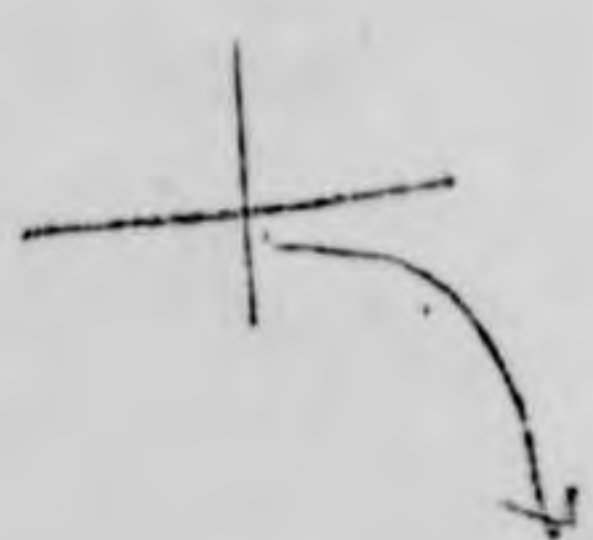



On the morning of 7 August 1952 at 0005E, Mr. [REDACTED] Whitcomb, Detroit, Michigan sighted an object in the sky over northern Detroit, Michigan. The object appeared to be the size of a large star and white in color, changing intermittently to red. No exhaust or sound was noticed by the observer. The speed of the object was estimated at approximately 100 to 150 miles per hour. The object appeared to stand motionless for a period of fifteen or twenty minutes, then drifted to the NNW and disappeared by drifting out of range of vision. The object was first sighted at 0005E and was observed until 0038E. Observation was visual ground only. Mr. [REDACTED] could not estimate the distance or the altitude of the object, but the object was located to the north of the observer. An angle of approximately 30 degrees from the ground was the angle of sighting.

Existing weather was: Clear sky, fifteen mile visibility, with wind from the NE at five miles per hour.

Two Jets took off at 2356E and had been within 30 miles NNW of Selfridge to 50 miles NNE of Selfridge. At 0038E the Jets were approximately 70 miles NNE of Selfridge. No other known aircraft were in the area. Detroit Municipal Airport is in the area near sighting.
