OF SIGHTING 2035 CST OBJECT APPEARED AS A BALL WITH A RING AROUND IT.
SOURCE EST HE SAW OBJECT FOR 3 SECONDS CMA THEN IT FADED FROM VIEW.
THIS HQ BELIEVES AT THIS TIME SOURCE SAW THE SAME OBJECT AS THE FIRST
OBSERVERS CMA ONLY AT A DIFFERENT ANGLE.
