Source at 2710 Hemphill, Ft Worth, Texas, at approximately 131700Z observed a stationary object just to the east of the moon. The object was whitish in color, round and cigar shaped; no sound, trail or exhaust was noticed. After observation of approximately 8 minutes, object moved so rapidly Source was unable to follow with the eye. Source estimated 7 to 11 miles altitude.

Source, [REDACTED], presently employed Department [REDACTED], Ft Worth, Texas. A part time student at SW Baptist Seminary, Ft Worth, Texas. Source alledged familiarity with all types US aircraft.

Comments

A check was made 131700Z with Weather Officer, 2nd Weather Sq, CAFB. One radiosonde balloon was released at 131500Z and another at 131540Z. The winds at 131700Z were 10 knots, 20,000 feet from 180°, at 25,000 feet, 10 knots from 270°. Moon rise on 13 Sept 52 was at 131235Z and at 131700Z would be approximately 54° above the horizon.

- No unusual aircraft flights were reported by any military agency during the sighting period.
