





1. At approximately 1940 hours, CST, 1 October 1952, Mrs. [REDACTED], sighted an unidentified flying object in the sky West of her ground position at [REDACTED], Pascagoula, Mississippi. The object, reported by the observer as being milky-white in color, was circular in shape. The object appeared to remain stationary for approximately five (5) to ten (10) minutes. It then began to move in a West-Southwest direction, changing to an oblong shape. The object traversed the sky in a smooth circular path until it disappeared from sight to the Northeast. The observer compared the size of the object to be somewhat larger than a standard basketball held at arms' length. No estimation of speed other than "extremely fast" was advanced by the observer. No aerodynamic features, sound, trail or exhaust were noted by observer.

2. The period of observation was estimated as being approximately twenty-two (22) minutes.

S T A T E M E N T

At approximately 1940 hours, we, the undersigned, heard a loud blast which caused us to run outdoors (1 October 1952). Looking up into the sky, Mrs. [REDACTED] sighted a round, powder-puff-shaped object. She subsequently called our attention to it. The object, milky-white in color, appeared to be in a direction West of our position at [REDACTED], Pascagoula, Mississippi. The object appeared to remain stationary for a period of approximately five (5) to ten (10) minutes; it then began to move in a West Southwest direction, changing from its circular shape to oblong as it traversed the sky to the Northeast, at which point the object faded from sight. We observed no trail or exhaust coming from the object; no propulsion system was observed. Although we cannot accurately estimate the speed of the object, not knowing the altitude (believed to be very high) or distance of the object from our ground position, we believe the speed to have been extremely fast. The period of observation was approximately twenty-two (22) minutes.

At approximately 1930 - 2000 hours, 1 October 1952, I, the undersigned, heard an explosion as I was driving along [REDACTED], Pascagoula, Mississippi. Mr. [REDACTED] [REDACTED], Pascagoula, Mississippi, called to me and pointed out a small, oblong object in the sky. At this time, Mr. [REDACTED] stated that the object had been circular in shape, but changed to its then oblong shape as it traversed the sky. The object disappeared from sight to the Northeast of my ground position.

I heard no sounds or witnessed no trail or exhaust coming from the object which appeared grayish-smoke in color. I estimate the time of observation as being approximately two (2) to three (3) minutes in length.






