



Three round, disc-shaped, unidentified flying objects that gave appearance of being of aluminum construction were observed 1930 hours, 20 October 1950, flying in a "V" formation over San Antonio, Texas.

In compliance with AF Letter 200-5, dated 20 April 1952, the following information is submitted:

(1) Objects were round, three in number, and flew a rough "V" formation. One object was estimated to be at a considerably lower altitude inasmuch as it appeared to be a bit more than twice the size of the other two objects and could be seen in greater detail. Size of lower object similar to that of a tennis ball held at arms length; the other two objects would more nearly equal size of half dollars held at arms length. Objects appeared to be of aluminum construction; yet, unlike aluminum, objects did not produce a blinding reflection of the sun. No aerodynamic features noted. No trail or exhaust noted nor was there any visible means of propulsion. No sound heard and speed estimated at two hundred fifty miles per hour. Objects flew a straight, level course and performed no maneuver, however, lower object flipped over slowly as it passed through the air. This flipping motion exposed first an aluminum-like surface on one side then an Olive Drab surface on the other. Flipping motion also exposed fine shape body. Objects approached observer until closest directly overhead, then the lower object stopped at which time observer concentrated his attention on it losing eye contact with the other two objects. After stopping, the lower object hovered a very short while, then commenced to get smaller very rapidly until it disappeared. When observer attempted to relocate other objects, they too had disappeared.

(2) Objects were sighted 1300 hours, C.T., 17 October 1952 and were observed from three to four minutes.

(3) A visual surface observation without electronic or optical equipment was made.

(4) Observer was at his residence, [REDACTED], San Antonio, Texas. Objects were in the North sky bearing due South at an estimated altitude of 15,000 feet (lower object) and 20,000 feet (remaining two objects).

(5) Objects were observed by Mr. & Mrs. [REDACTED] above address. Reliability of observer and witness unknown. However, Mr. [REDACTED] states that he spent six years in the US Air Force as an Enlisted Man on flight duty and that he became quite familiar with conventional types of aircraft. He is presently employed as a buyer for the Alamo Lumber Co, 2110 S. Flores, San Antonio, Texas.

(6) Fair weather prevailed at the time of the sighting.

(7) No activity or condition, meteorological or otherwise, is known to have existed which might account for the sighting.

(8) No physical evidence of the sighting.

(9) No interception or identification action taken.

(10) Location of any air traffic in the general area at the time of the sighting unknown with the exception of twin engined aircraft noted on the enclosed statement.

S T A T E M E N T

I observed three unidentified flying objects at 1:30 PM, 19 October 1952, Central Standard Time, from the porch of my residence, [REDACTED] San Antonio, Texas.

I had been sitting on the porch smoking for approximately twenty-five minutes before this incident occurred. As I sat there, I noticed a four-engined aircraft circle the Municipal Airport once then come in rather high for an approach landing. The plane cut its engines and commenced backfiring, drawing my attention closer to the aircraft.

At this time I noticed three circular objects in the North sky heading due South. One object was at a noticeably lower altitude than the other two; at any rate it was more than twice as large as the other objects. I would estimate the lower object to be approximately fifteen thousand feet and the other two at approximately twenty thousand feet altitude. The objects were flying a "V" formation. The lower object gave me the impression of flipping over slowly as it traveled through the air. This flipping movement exposed first an aluminum-like surface on one side then an Olive Drab one on the other. The other objects did not flip and appeared to be of aluminum construction.

I would estimate the speed of the objects to be approximately two hundred fifty miles per hour. The objects kept approaching until almost directly overhead; then the lower object stopped. I concentrated my attention on the lower object and lost sight of the other two. After the lower object stopped, it hovered a very short time, then commenced to get smaller and smaller very rapidly until it disappeared. I do not

THE SIZE OF A HALF DOLLAR HELD AT ARMS LENGTH. NO AERODYNAMIC
FEATURES NOTED. NO TRAIL OR EXHAUST NOR ANY VISIBLE
MEANS OF PROPULSION WAS NOTED. ESTIMATED SPEED 250 MILES
PER HOUR. OBJECTS MADE NO SOUND NOR DID THEY PERFORM ANY
MANEUVERS HOWEVER THE LOWER OBJECT GAVE APPEARANCE OF
FLIPPING OVER SLOWLY AS IT MOVED THROUGH THE AIR EXPOSING AN
