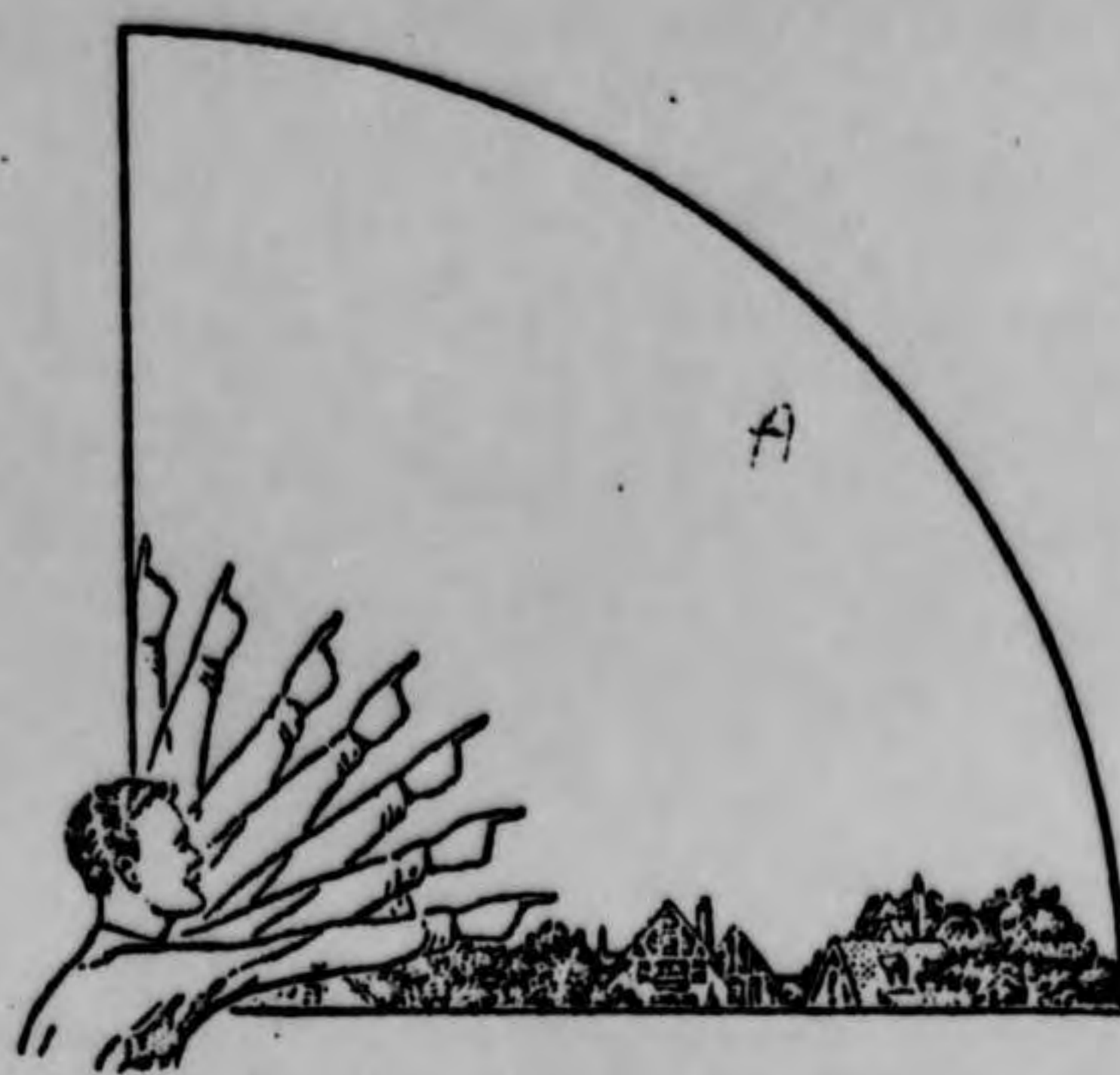

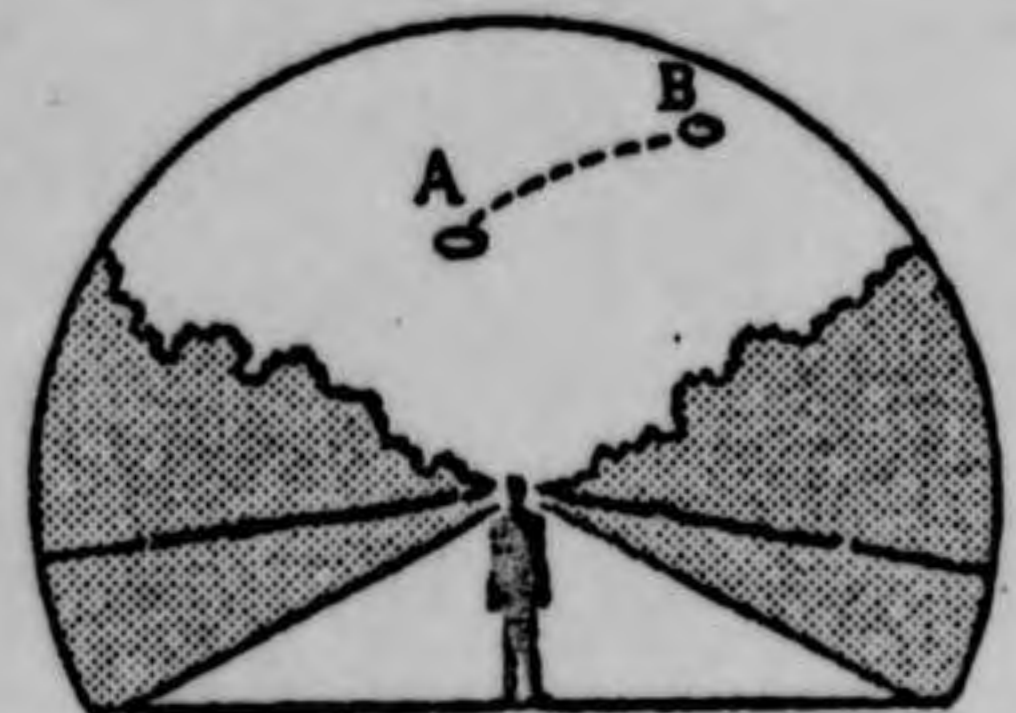
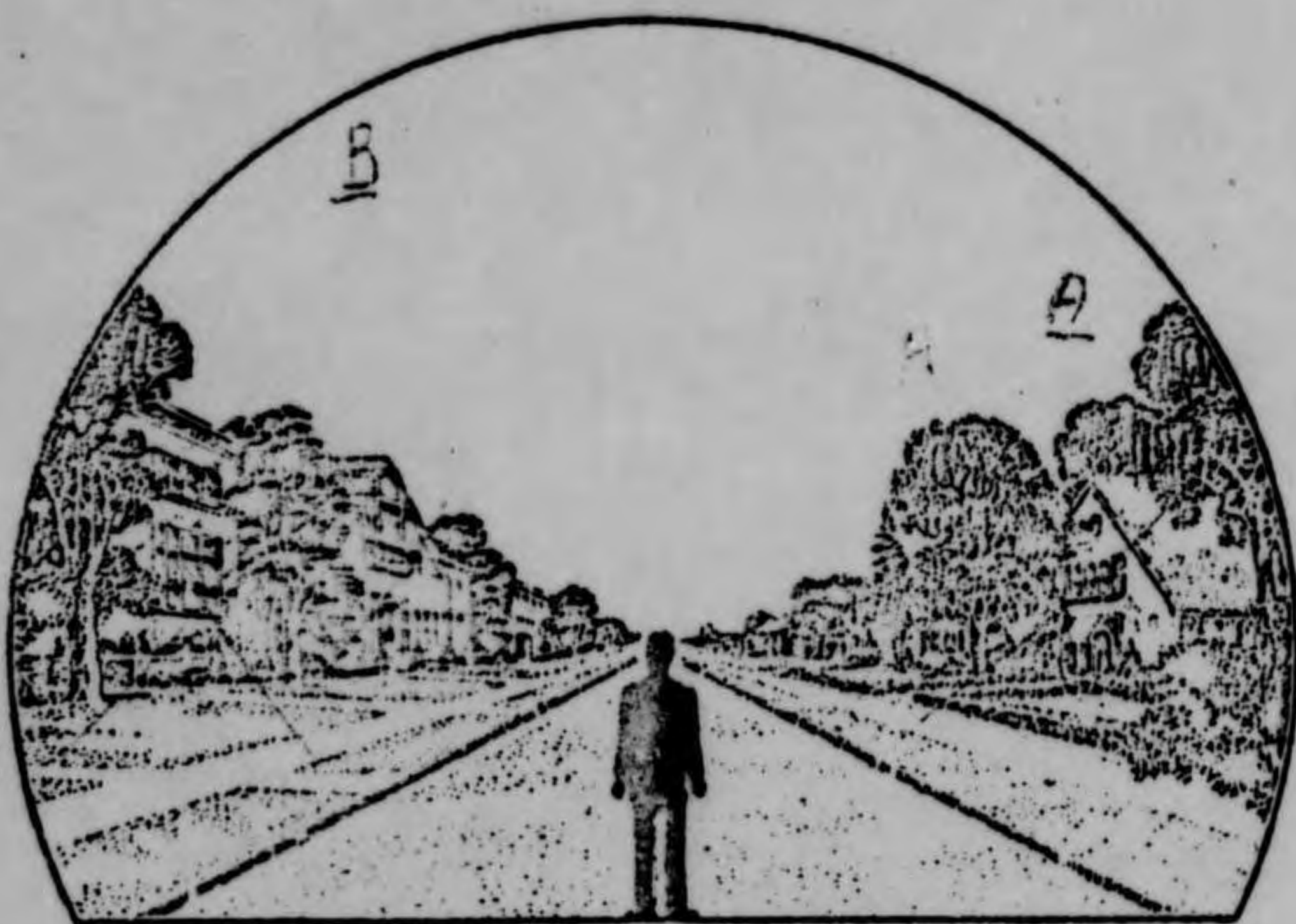

I on December of 1952 I was training for [REDACTED] Baseball try out school in St. Augustine Florida a five week school starting in January of 1953.

Each night I would run 1 1/2 miles as part of my training, I had just pulled up to a walk after running and to my right (west) I saw the saucer in one place for about 10 seconds, there were 5 or 6 windows lit up inside with white lights, the saucers outer rim was spinning and I could hear its hum, the saucer had a silver color and a bluish flame was burning at the rear of the saucer, then the bluish flame turned to a big bright red flame and the saucer shot up and clear across the sky at a terrific speed. I do not believe the Saucer was made on earth, Russia or the United States would be far more advanced in Space Science than they are today, am I right? if so is the Planet known?


Mr. President I am sure you know a great deal more on this subject than I do.

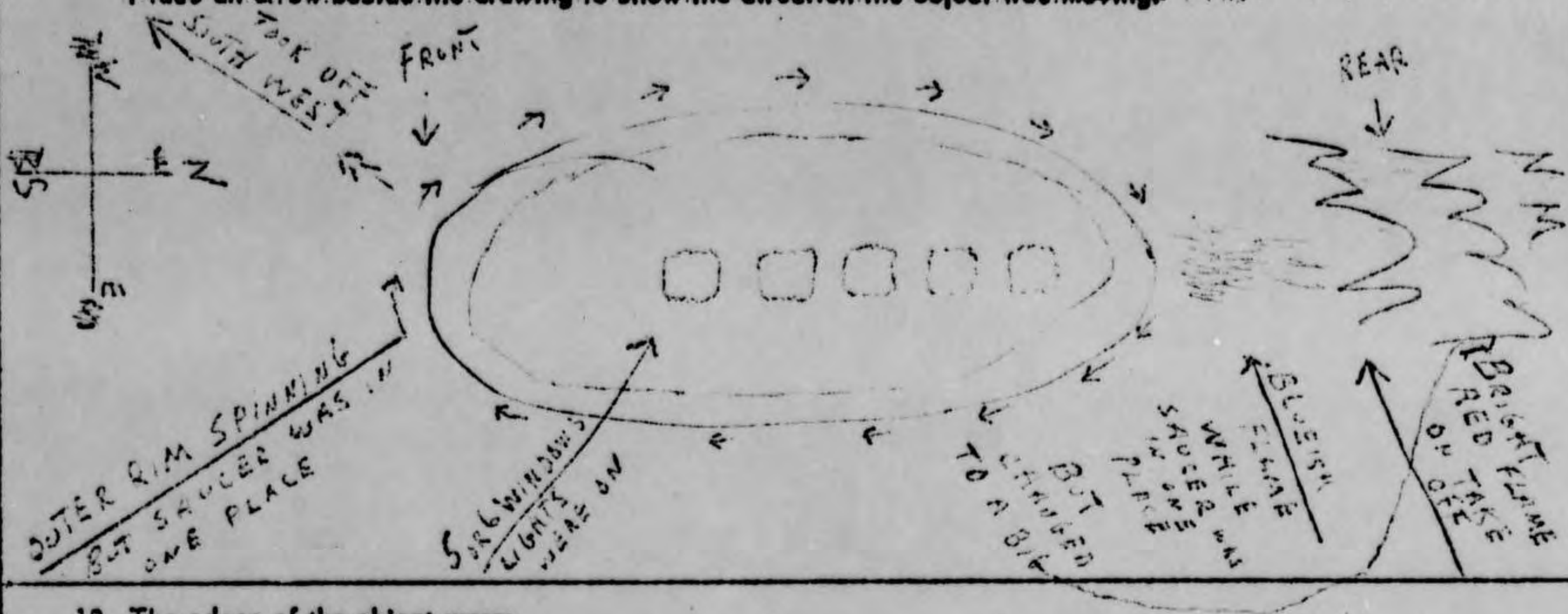

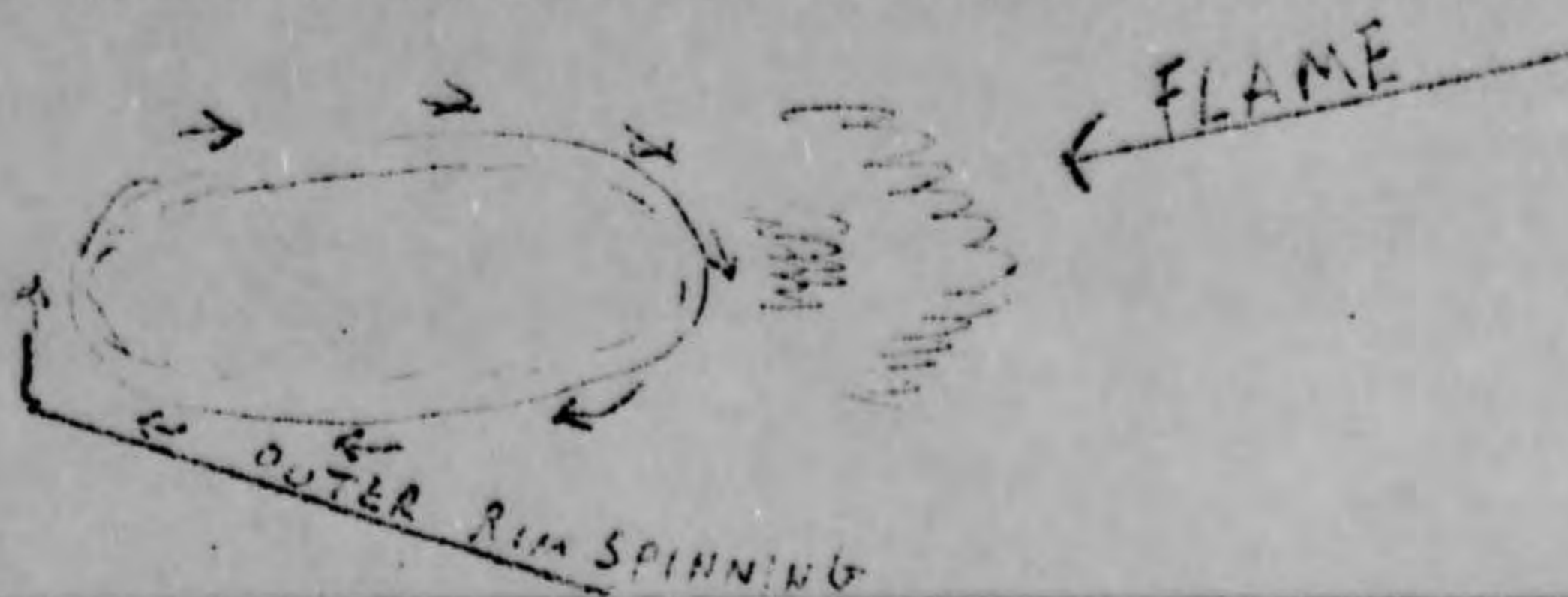
