In accordance with Air Force Letter 200-5 dated 29 April 1952, the following information is submitted:

- (1) A single, cigar shaped object was seen flashing low across the sky by Mrs Alice Dieter, a civilian employee at Kelly AF Base, Texas. Object appeared to the observer to be approximately three by six feet and emitted a green, phosphorescent color. No aerodynamic features were noticed by observer. Observer could not recall having seen any trail or exhaust nor hear any noise made by object. Object flew a straight and level flight at a tremendous, but undetermined, rate of speed. Observer stated that object traveled faster than any conventional aircraft seen by her. Object disappeared rapidly.
- (2) The observer was uncertain about the time object was sighted but states that it was between 2300 hours 15 July 1952 and 0200 hours 16 July 1952, Central Standard Time. Length of time observed estimated at between three to five seconds.
- (3) A visual ground observation was made.
- (4) The observer was at her residence, [REDACTED], San Antonio, Texas at the time of sighting. Object was in the Southeast sky, bearing West, distance undetermined, altitude estimated at 150 to 200 feet.
- (5) Reliability of observer unknown.
- (6) Fair weather prevailed at the time of the sighting.
- (7) No apparent logical explanation for the sighting.
- (8) No physical evidence of sighting.
- (9) No interception or identification action taken.
- (10) Location of any air traffic in the general area at the time of the sighting unknown.
