In accordance with AF Letter 200-5, dated 29 April 1952, the following report was submitted by W/Sgt [REDACTED], 28th Armament and Electronics Squadron, 28th Strategic Reconnaissance Wing, Rapid City Air Force Base, Weaver, South Dakota.
