In accordance with AF Letter 200-5, dated 29 April 1952, the following report was submitted by H/Sgt [REDACTED], 28th Armament and Electronics Squadron, 28th Strategic Reconnaissance Wing, Rapid City Air Force Base, Cheyenne, South Dakota.

1. Orange colored discs that glowed. 12 to 14 objects were visible in two (2) "V" formations. No sound was perceptible. Objects flight path was straight and level, as they continued in flight they gave an appearance of a line of lights. Speed of objects was many times that of a jet aircraft.

2. 17 July 1952 at 2200 MST. Were visible for about 5 to 6 seconds.

3. Were seen from a car, parked in drive-in theater. Windows of the car were down.

4. Three and one-half miles east of Rapid City, S. Dakota. Objects were east of observer at about 5 miles, altitude between 12,000 to 15,000 feet, traveling in an easterly direction.

5. Observer is considered reliable; he has had previous experience as aircraft crew member and is presently working in Armament and Electronics. Observer was accompanied by a young lady who verifies seeing objects.
