



FLYCBRPT

1. Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED] sighted four circular discus shaped objects which gave off a luminous light. The light was more intense at the center of the object than it was at the edges. They appeared to be about two feet in diameter. They flew south in a staggered formation, the leading object being on the west side of the formation, the trailing object being on the east side of the formation. They flew toward observers, came up almost over their car, then wheeled west in formation like a flock of ducks, then wheeled north in the same fashion, and then vanished. They did not appear to go out of sight or into the haze or darkness. They vanished. Speed was under one hundred miles per hour. The objects made no sound. They left no trail or exhaust.

Formation as they Approached Car



2. Sighted 17/0010 Central Standard Time for about fifteen seconds.

3. Sighted visually through the automobile windshield.

4. Observers were on State Highway 33. They had just turned off U. S. Highway 61. They were driving north at about 25 miles per hour. The objects were first sighted about 1/4 of a city block away. They approached from the North, flying south, came up almost directly over the car, turned West, then turned North and vanished. They appeared to be about 1/2 a block away when they vanished. They appeared to be about 200 feet above the ground.

5. Mr. [REDACTED] reported that he is a private investigator and insurance adjuster. His office address is 711 A Pioneer Building, St. Paul, Minnesota.

6. a. Duluth weather station report transmitted at 17/0030 CST follows. Sky condition, 15 hundred scattered, 65 hundred overcast; visibility, 10 miles; light thunderstorms; wind, SSW 12. Remarks; thunder in all quadrants, movement unknown; severe lightning, cloud to ground and cloud to cloud.

b. Surface synoptic chart shows that thunder storm was passing over area of sighting at approximate time of sighting.

c. The observers of the objects did not state the weather conditions which prevailed at the time of the sighting.
