This report covers sighting of unidentified flying objects made while driving in area approximately six miles S. E. of Pinewood, Sumner County, N. C.

On Friday, 25 January 1953, at 2120 an unidentified flying object was sighted by Mr. [REDACTED] wife, and [REDACTED] wife, all civilians. The object was the size of a road sign, completely white with a trail of orange and red streamers which jerked out intermittently. The object which seemed several miles away hovered about 250 feet over a wooded area. As the object hovered it swayed slightly side to side and up and down. After hovering five minutes, the object speed approximately ten miles in a split second to the west and then again hovered for a period of seven minutes. The object then seemed to go in complete reverse losing altitude and disappearing behind the woods. A glow could be observed in the area when the object disappeared.

No known searchlights are in that area.

Weather clear, night visibility unlimited, no moon.

All observers were civilians and completely untrained.

Aircraft arriving at nearby Shaw AFB at a plus or minus tolerance of ten minutes at the time of sighting observed nothing. Three of these aircraft were the L-20 type which fly at low cruising speed and at a low altitude.
