<p>This report covers sighting of unidentified flying objects made while driving in area approximately six miles S. E. of Pinewood, Hunter County, N. J.</p> <p>On Sunday, 25 January 1953, at 2120 an unidentified flying object was sighted by Mr. [REDACTED] wife, and [REDACTED] [REDACTED], wife, all civilians. The object was the size of a road sign, completely white with a trail of orange and red streamers which flashed out intermittently. The object which neared several miles away hovered about 250 feet over a wooded area. As the object hovered it swayed slightly side to side and up and down. After hovering five minutes, the object sped approximately ten miles in a split second to the west and then again hovered for a period of seven minutes. The object then seemed to go in complete reverse losing altitude and disappearing behind the woods. A glow could be observed in the area when the object disappeared.</p> <p>No known searchlights are in that area.</p> <p>Weather clear, night visibility unlimited, no moon.</p> <p>All observers were civilians and completely untrained.</p> <p>Aircraft arriving at nearby Shaw AFB at a plus or minus tolerance of ten minutes of the time of sighting observed nothing.
