On the 26 January 1953, Mr. [REDACTED] of Baraboo, Wisconsin a ground observer reported sighting a flying object southeast of his home post at 2245Z. He describes the object to be no particular shape, larger than a star, it was brighter than a star, and varied in intensity. There was one (1) object, no formation, and was not a rocket or jet. The color of the object was Red, Green, White and Blue. He also stated the object he visually observed was very high and its speed was approximately 10 mph. Mr. [REDACTED] also stated he observed this object for 1 hour and 55 min after which the object continued on a south easterly heading and disappeared into a cloud. The object as it disappeared had a bluish green color. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that it was a clear bright moonlight night with a few clouds when he observed this object.
