




Discs Return to Calif.

SANTA ANA, Calif., Jan. 30

—Reports by several persons, including two veteran pilots, of
disk-shaped objects streaking
thru Southern California skies
were under investigation today
by Air Force, Marine Corps and
CAA officials.

Four such objects were reported to have been seen flying in apparent formation by the three-man crew of a Northrup Aircraft Co. plane yesterday afternoon.

A Marine Corps jet fighter pilot said he chased a fiery object for nearly 25c miles Wednesday night before he was forced to turn back when he ran low on fuel. At the same time, control tower operators at Long Beach Municipal Airport reported they saw an "eerie orange flame" in the sky.

The two pilots and photographer in the Northrup plane said they watched the four disks yesterday for about five minutes until the mysterious objects disappeared beyond a mountain peak.

Photographer Jim Wilkinson did

He said two of the disks were flying above the other two and estimated their attitude at about 20,000 feet.

The Marine pilot failed to identify the "round amber light" he chased for some 25 miles.

The pilot, Maj. Harvey N. Patton of Salt Lake City, discounted the possibility that it was a star "because it was not high enough and was moving."

Edward S. Downs, Civil Aeronautics tower controller at Long Beach airport, reported "an orange object resembling a ball of fire" at an altitude of several thousand feet near the airport.

Memorandum for Record

2 February 1953

On 31 Jan 53, Capt E. J. Ruppelt contacted the D/I of the 27th Air Division, Norton AFB, California, to inquire about the series of UFO sightings in the area. He stated that the 27th AD had only one sighting that occurred on the 30th of Jan ary near Palm Springs. Fighters were scrambled but no contact was made. A cross-check with the GOC showed a weather balloon in the area, so it was not reported but was written off as

a weather balloon.

The D/I stated that all during the period of these reports, 23, 29, and 30 January, no unidentified radar tracks correlated with the UFO reports.

He knew nothing of the Northrup report except that a newspaper said that the CAA tower at Santa Monica had seen four C-47 a/c in formation close to the time of the sighting. He had no knowledge of the Marine incident at El Toro.


