Approximately one minute later another object of the same description appeared on the same course. The second object continued on a course due west, then dropped over the horizon. During these sightings Captain Gleason described the weather as perfectly clear, visibility unlimited. Each sighting was in view for approximately 15 seconds.

These sightings were witnessed and confirmed by lat Lt. Joseph A. Pichler and lat Lt. Laurence H. Duval Jr., both Air Force Officers. (Captain Gleason and Lt. Duval are rated personnel.) Sightings were made by the maked eye. The observers were located on the ground at the northern section of Maxwell Air Force Base.
